

NANA NORMANDE SHOW HISTORY-PART 2

2020 will mark the fourteenth year Normande breeders have had a NANA organized and sponsored show to exhibit their Normandes at. Prior to 2007, breeders exhibited their Normandes independently at local, county and state fairs. During that period of time when NANA did not sponsor/organize a Normande show, breeders participated in a couple of shows that recognized the Normande breed with specific classes for Normandes, the Minnesota State Fair and the World Beef Expo. Beyond that, the majority of Normande breeders found themselves competing against other breeds in "Any Other Breed" classes.



In 2007, things changed for a couple of reasons. First, for a number of years Jerome Chateau of Normande Genetics, had been working on developing an open class dairy Normande show during the Minnesota State Fair. The open class dairy Normande show at the Minnesota State Fair was held for four years before it was discontinued. One of the requirements for an animal to be eligible to be shown in this show was their sire had to be a French Normande bull. This stipulation for eligibility certainly showcased French Normande genetics. 2007 was the last year for the Normande show at the Minnesota State Fair


At the Normande show during the Minnesota State Fair in 2007 eight Normande breeders exhibited thirty-eight animals. Dr. Les Hansen of the University of Minnesota was the judge. Dr. Hansen chose Car-Bon Nivea Rosemarie-ET as the Junior Champion Female. She was exhibited by Carl and Bonnie Werner of Beaver Dam, WI. Railane Messager Monique-ET was selected as the Reserve Junior Champion Female. She was exhibited by Barbara Wogsland of Scandinavia, WI. Both of these winning heifers were the result of full blood embryos imported from France.






In the milking cow

classes, Barb Wogsland's entries dominated the mature cow show. Her winning senior two year old, Baeten Fukrain Delilah, was selected as Grand Champion. Wogsland's winning aged cow, Baeten Entoi Venessa, was selected as the Reserve Grand Champion. Both of these mature cows were bred by Ken Baeten of Denmark, WI, were sired by French bulls, and they were 50% Normande.






Secondly, in 2007 NANA combined its Field Day and Annual Membership Meeting with a Normande beef show at the fairgrounds in Manchester, IA. Four breeders from WI and IA exhibited 25 head that were judged by Frank Albertson of Iowa. Those breeders were Jeff and Nona Bock, River Falls, WI; Wayne and Lisa Dewey of Iowa Falls, IA; Bruce and Ben Bolen of Tama, IA at that time; and the Mueller family from Rewey, WI with the herd prefix at that time of Maranatha-Way Normandes (MW).


After judging the bulls, Albertsen selected Wayne and Lisa Dewey's yearling bull, Circle D Samuel Noble as the Grand Champion Beef Bull.

His sire is Circle D Noble Rock 91N and is 93% Normande. Selected as the Reserve Champion Bull was BBN Scott Martin, his sire is DBN Simba Scott 82 and is 88% Normande. He was exhibited by Bruce and Ben Bolen of Tama, IA.

In the female show, Circle D Foolers Lucky Taylor (88% Normande) was selected as the Grand Champion Beef Female. She is sired by CDF Land Fooler 622M and was shown by Wayne and Lisa Dewey of Iowa Falls, IA. Selected as Reserve Grand Champion Beef Female was Crick Ridge Sophia (91% Normande). She is sired by RGN Nicholas 27N and was shown by Jeff and Nona Bock of River Falls, WI.










2008 World Dairy Expo. As a part of Cinor 2008, the World Dairy Expo Board of Directors allowed the presence of a special Normande Pavillion containing a live display of nine registered Normande cows on the outdoor trade show mall.

During the week of the 2008 Cinor and World Dairy Expo, NANA held its first national Normande show on October 3, 2008, at the Iowa

County Fairgrounds in Mineral Point, WI. Observing the show were nearly 100 Cinor attendees from Europe and South America.



There were forty-two dairy and beef Normandes exhibited at this show. They were exhibited by six breeders from Iowa and Wisconsin. Those breeders were: Wayne and Lisa Dewey of Iowa Falls, IA; Ken Rabas of Wellman, IA at that time; Jeff and Nona Bock of River Falls, WI; Barbara Wogsland of Scandinavia, WI; Rhonda Treml-Knebel of Arpin, WI; and the Michael Mueller family of Rewey, WI. Frank Albertson of Toledo, IA, judged the dairy and beef show. Albertson had judged the Normande show held in Manchester, IA, a year earlier.

Sixteen head were shown in

the dairy portion of the show. Barb Wogsland's entries dominated the show in a spectacular way. In the heifer show her yearling heifer, New Hope Redondo Estelle, 75% Normande, was selected as the Junior Champion Dairy Heifer. And her senior heifer calf, New Hope Primate Minocqua-ET, 100% Normande, was chosen as the Reserve Junior Champion Dairy Heifer.



During the placing of the mature cow



classes, Judge Albertson did a classy thing by asking a French and Columbian Cinor participant to assist him in placing the mature cow classes and in selecting the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Dairy Cow. Named the Grand Champion Dairy Cow was New Hope Messager Monique-ET. 100% Normande and sired by Messager. Selected as Reserve Grand Champion Dairy Cow was New Hope Redondo Delilah (Also known as Baeten Redondo Delilah.) 50% Normande and sired by Redondo.

Twenty-six head were exhibited in the beef show. Similar to Barb Wogsland's sweep of the dairy show, Wayne and Lisa Dewey and family of Iowa Falls, IA swept the beef show champions and reserve champions with their four entries. Unfortunately pictures of the beef show winners were not taken.

Circle D Samuel Noble (93% Normande) was selected as the Grand Champion bull (See his picture above.). One year earlier, Noble had been



named the Grand Champion bull of the Normande show in Manchester, IA. Named the Reserve Grand Champion Bull was Circle D Ultra Fooler.

Chosen as Grand Champion Beef Female was Circle D Miss Fooler. Circle D Miss Fooler Ultra Rocky was named the Reserve Grand Champion Beef Female.



Because of the positive and successful 2008 show, the NANA Board of Directors, at that time, decided to continue what was created in 2008 and tagged the 2009 show as the National Show for the Normande breed in the United States. Because of the centrality of the Iowa County Fairgrounds in Mineral Point, WI, for those who wanted to exhibit their Normandes, the NANA National Show has been held in Mineral Point, WI since.

With the show designated as a National Normande Show, exhibitors went the extra mile in making their show string displays very attractive. And NANA added some special features as well. At the end of the show arena a handsomely decorated area was created for taking pictures of the

show champions under NANA's banner. The show champions in the dairy and beef show received unique trophies in the form of hand painted glass plates. And members of the board of directors provided a free lunch consisting of barbecued hamburger, buns, chips, homemade bars, and beverages for everyone in attendance.

In 2009 the National Normande show had eight breeders from three states exhibit fifty-one Normandes. Twenty-one of those Normandes were shown in the dairy show by four breeders from Wisconsin. Those breeders were: George Polzin, Cadott, WI (Polzin Farms); Rhonda Treml-Knebel, Arpin, WI (Howling-Oaks Normandes); Carl and Bonnie Werner, Beaver Dam, WI (Car-



Bon Normandes); and Barb Wogsland, Scandinavia, WI (New Hope Normandes). Twenty-nine beef Normandes were exhibited by four breeders from Iowa, Missouri, and Wisconsin. Those breeders were: Jeff and Nona Bock, River Falls, WI (Crick Ridge Farm); Wayne and Lisa Dewey, Iowa Falls, IA (Circle D Farm); Bruce and Connie Bolen, Greentop, MO (Cedar Lane Normandes); and Michael Mueller and family, Rewey, WI (Maranatha-Way Normandes).





Judges for the show were Ray Kuehl of Waunakee, WI and Gregg May of Mineral Point, WI. Kuehl is a nationally recognized Holstein breeder and dairy cattle judge. May is a nationally recognized Angus breeder and beef cattle judge.




In the dairy show, the Junior Champion Female was New-Hope Redondo Delta-ET, exhibited by Barb Wogsland of Scandinavia, WI. 75% Normande and the winner of the Winter Heifer class, she was an embryo transplant resulting from the mating of Redondo and New Hope Fukrain Delilah. Delilah was the Grand Champion of the Minnesota State Fair Normande Show in 2007, and the Reserve Grand Champion of the 2008 Normande show related to Cinor 2008.

The Reserve Junior Champion Female in the dairy show was Car-Bon N Royal Holl Ruthie-ET. A full blood Normande (100%) exhibited by Carl and Bonnie Werner of Beaver Dam, WI. Also a result of an embryo transplant, her dam is Car-Bon N Nivea Rosemarie-ET (see picture above) and her sire is

Royal Holl. Her dam, Rosemarie, had been selected as the Junior Champion Female at the 2007 Minnesota State Fair Normande show and was the winner of the Dry Cow Class of the 2009 National Normande Show.

Selected as the Grand Champion Dairy of the 2019 National Normande Show was the lone entry of George Polzin of Cadott, WI, Polzin Farm Miglou Nichol. She is a 75% Normande sired by Miglou and out of Baeten Giophare Norma, the Grand Champion Normande cow at the 2005 and 2006 Normande show at the Minnesota State Fair.

Selected as the Reserve Grand Champion Dairy was New Hope Redondo Estelle, exhibited by Barb Wogsland of Scandinavia, WI. A 75% Normande, she is sired by Redondo and was selected as the Junior Champion Dairy Female of the 2008 NANA Normande Show.





The beef segment of the 2009 National Show was dominated by the Wayne and Lisa Dewey Family of Iowa Falls, IA. Their winner of the Junior Bull Calf Class, Circle D Majestic Hawk, was selected as the Grand Champion Bull. He is a son of Circle D Knight Hawk 42P and is 93% Normande. Unfortunately the NANA office does not have a record of what bull was named Reserve Grand Champion Beef Bull, or who the breeder/exhibitor was.

In the female classes, the Dewey family had both the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Beef with their first and second place heifers from the Junior Yearling Heifer Class. Winner of the Junior Yearling Heifer Class was Circle D Foolermans Luck and she was selected to be Grand Champion. Standing second

place in the same heifer class was Circle D Foolers Ultra Rocky, and she was selected as the Reserve Grand Champion Beef. Both heifers are sired by Circle D Foolerman 51R, and they are 88% and 96% Normande respectively.





An added addition to the 2009 National Normande Show was a National Sale of registered Normandes. NANA had not had sponsored a public auction of Normande cattle since the 1990's. So with no guarantees about how the sale might go, five breeders consigned ten animals (two dairy and eight beef) and a number of units of semen. Three of the consignments were bulls and the remaining were heifers.

Ray Kuehl, the dairy judge, donated his auctioneering services to assist NANA with the sale. And as is common with breed association sponsored sales, each consignment had a minimum bid that had to be reached before it was actually sold.

Even though the association sponsored sale was well planned and had a nice sale catalog of the consignments, the results of the sale were not as had been hoped and planned for. Most of the semen that was offered was sold and went to a number of buyers. Two of the ten consigned animals received high enough bids to be sold. The late Richard Lange of Platteville, WI purchased Circle D Hawkman, a bull calf consigned by Wayne and Lisa Dewey of Iowa Falls, IA. Hawkman is a 95% Normande sired by Circle D Foolerman 51R. Britta Bolen of Greentop, MO purchased MW TL Vanity 02V. Vanity was consigned by the Michael Mueller Family of Rewey, WI. She is a 90% Normande sired by Sun Valley TL C5R.

2020 NATIONAL NORMANDE SHOW WILL BE HELD

Unless there is a very drastic change in government policy concerning the Covid-19 pandemic, the 2020 National Show will be held as scheduled. During their early July board meeting, the NANA Board of Directors made the decision to go ahead with the 2020 National Show and Annual Membership Meeting. The date for the membership meeting is September 18, 2020 at 7:00 pm in the Schimming Building at the Iowa County Fairgrounds in Mineral Point, WI. The show will be held the next day, September 19, 2020, at 11:00 am. During the show, the NANA Board of Directors will provide a free lunch for all exhibitors and attendees.

Included in this newsletter are the show rules, the show classes, show entries, and the official announcement of the Annual Membership Meeting. If you have any questions call the NANA office.

In past shows, dairy and beef classes were alternated as the show progressed. 2019 saw a change to all beef classes showing first and then all dairy classes after the beef show had been completed. This change was made because 2019 saw most of the dairy animals arriving on Saturday morning and not having much time to prepare for their classes. The 2020 show will continue with all beef showing first and then all dairy.

- *Any Normande breeder or owner is eligible to exhibit at the show.
- *Cattle exhibited must be registered or eligible for registration in the North American Normande Association herd book
- *Cattle can arrive no earlier than 8 am Friday September 20, 2019.
- *Cattle will be released as soon as the show is over.
- *Exhibitors are expected to assist with the cleaning of the barns immediately after the show. (A skid steer and spreaders will be there to make it easier and quicker.)
- *Cattle must have at least 50% Normande genetics.
- *IF ANIMALS ARE NOT YET REGISTERED THERE WILL BE REGISTRATION APPLICATIONS AVAILABLE AT THE SHOW AND CAN BE SUBMITTED TO THE NANA REGISTRY SECRETARY BEFORE 11:00 AM ON SEPTEMBER 20, 2020.

ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS (See Wisconsin regulations below.)

JUDGING

- *Showmanship classes will be judged before placings classes.
- *Separate classes will be held for dairy and beef Normandes.
- *See entry form for class selections. If a class has less than 2 entries, it may be combined with another class. If a class has a large number of entries it may be split into two or three classes.
- *Class order will be Bulls, Heifers and Cows. During the show beef classes will show first and then the dairy classes. During the 2019 show all the beef classes were shown first and then the dairy classes. This was done to allow the dairy exhibitor's time to prepare their animals for showing since many of them arrived at the show that morning.
- *Qualified judges will be hired to place each class.
- *Ribbons will be awarded to the first four places in every class and trophies/platters will be awarded to the Champion and Reserve Champion is each division.

FACILITIES

The Iowa County Fairground is located on Fair Street in Mineral Point, WI.

No bedding or feed will be provided; all exhibiters must bring their own.

RV or camper parking is available at the fairgrounds and several motels are located in Mineral Point.

WISCONSON HEALTH PAPER REQUIREMENTS

This is a summary of animal health requirements for fairs, shows and exhibitions only. They are not necessarily the same as requirements for importing animals into Wisconsin or moving them within the state for other purposes. They may change if animal diseases occur in Wisconsin or elsewhere, so you should always check Wisconsin's website (www.datcp.wi.gov) or contact them at 608-224-4872 for current information.

General Requirements

Animals that show evidence of having contagious or infectious diseases may not be commingled (or housed/kept) with other animals at a fair, show, or other exhibition in such a way as to allow disease to spread. Such animals should not attend the fair, show, or exhibition. Animals may be denied entry if they arrive at these events with contagious or infectious diseases, isolated and/or removed if they develop disease after arriving, or be subject to other action as would be necessary to control disease.

Bovine animals with ringworm, mange, warts or scab will be removed from the fair or exhibition premises, unless the veterinarian in charge finds warts or ringworm lesions are incapable of transmitting disease.

Cattle from within Wisconsin have no requirements for tests or health documents.

Cattle from outside Wisconsin must:

Be accompanied by certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI or health certificate) documenting official animal identification (ID) and all required tests and certifications Have at least one form of official individual ID (including steers)

Meet all of Wisconsin's normal requirements for import (see https://datcp.wi.gov/Pages/Programs_Services/CattleBison.aspx)

Acceptable animal IDs for all cattle from outside Wisconsin:

USDA metal ear tag number that is part of the National Uniform Eartagging System (NUES)

(starts with state 2-digit code, also known as "brite" tag); this includes the orange brucellosis vaccination tag

15-digit "840" tags (visual or RFID)

Valid only if applied before March 11, 2015:

- o Manufacturer-coded RFID tag 15-digit number with the first three digits in 900s
- o American ID tag 8 to 12-digit number prefaced with "USA"

Brucellosis requirements for cattle from outside Wisconsin: No cattle from outside Wisconsin are currently required to be brucellosis tested or vaccinated to come to fairs and shows in Wisconsin

Tuberculosis (TB) requirements for cattle from outside Wisconsin: For requirements by state, see: https://datcp.wi.gov/Pages/Programs_Services/CattleBison.aspx

Cattle from Michigan's Modified Accredited Zone (for cattle from Michigan's TB Free Zone, see requirements by state above) also need:

Import permit

To originate from a herd that has a negative whole-herd TB test within 12 months before arrival in Wisconsin that includes all animals 1 year and older

Negative individual TB tests within 60 days before entering Wisconsin

To return directly to the state of origin after the show, and there must be a statement on the CVI that they will be doing so

OUR SHOW JUDGES

The judges for our 2020 National Normande Show come from the state of Iowa and have known each other and have been good friends for many years.



Judging the dairy portion of our show will be Eric Lyons of Toledo, IA. Eric and his wife, Terry, have five children. He is a graduate of Iowa State University and after graduation he worked for the former Curtiss Breeding Company. During his employment with Curtiss Breeding Company Eric traveled all over the entire Unites States and traveled abroad as well. Following his stint with Curtiss, Eric returned to the family dairy farm partnership (Lyons Jerseys LLC) and milked registered Jerseys for forty years. The Lyon's registered Jersey herd was recognized internationally as an outstanding herd of Jerseys. One of the cows they sold from their herd was the Reserve All-American at the Louisville National Jersey Show for two years in a row. And the dam of one of the most popular Jersey bulls at Select Sires in recent years, River Valley Cece Chrome, was sold from their herd. In 2015, Lyons Jerseys LLC was awarded the coveted Master Jersey Breeder Award by the American Jersey Association.

Prior to leaving dairying in October, 2018, Eric served as a director on the National Jersey Association Board of Directors. Eric has judged Dairy cattle of all breeds at many state and local shows. He has judged the Columbian (South America) National Jersey Show twice.

He has also judged the Open, Futurity and Junior National Jersey Shows in Louisville, KY.

Since leaving the dairy business nearly two years ago, Eric and his family have transitioned their farming operation to a herd of Red Angus and commercial beef cows.

Judging the beef portion of our show will be David Bolen of Tama, IA. David, his wife, Ann, have four children and five grandchildren. Even though David and Ann both worked off of the farm before retiring (David for the Pacific Union Railroad and Ann as an elementary school teacher.), they have been breeding and raising Normandes since the early 1980's. They got their start with Normandes with the help of David's brothers, Bruce and Ben. Since David enjoyed showing cattle as a youth, he and Ann made sure their four children (Ashley, Ann, Sara, and Scott) had the opportunity to show their Normandes at numerous shows and fairs. The Bolen family had significant success in the show ring (See "Normande Show History" in the January, February, March 2020 Normande Happenings)\.



David and Ann currently have a herd of Normande beef on their farm. Over the years they have built up a clientele of private buyers of their fattened Normandes. For each of the past three years, they have privately sold twelve animals to friends and family as freezer beef.

NANA BY-LAWS CHANGES

Another matter discussed during the July 2020 NANA Board of Directors meeting were changes to the NANA By-Laws. Currently the By-Laws have the Board of Directors at nine members. Prior to the increase to nine members the board had only six members. It was increased to nine to have more representation from the dairy element within NANA. The change had its purpose fulfilled by balancing the NANA board of directors.

Since 2018 there have been three board of director members who have resigned and terminated their NANA membership. One of the board vacancies was filled with an annual meeting election. Two vacancies have not been filled and have remained open for over a year now. The current NANA board consciously made the decision to leave the two vacancies unfilled even though the board could have filled them by appointing individuals to the empty seats on the board. There were two reasons for leaving the vacancies unfilled. First, for the past fifteen years plus, there has been very little or no nominee competition during the elections for the Board of Directors. It is hoped with a reduced number of directors on the board there may be more competition. Second, over the past year the current NANA Board of Directors have found the work of NANA can be accomplished quite efficiently with seven board members when compared to nine members.

Thus members in attendance of the Annual Membership Meeting will be voting on the proposed changes. The NANA office will be sending a letter with the proposed changes to all current NANA members prior to the Annual Membership Meeting. Watch for it in the mail.






