1. This is our final message in the book of Hebrews. As a result of this series, what themes from the book continue to stay with you? What would you see as one of the prevailing purposes of Hebrews, and how does this help you in your Christian walk?
2. What are a few points from this week's message that connected with you the most?
3. Read Hebrews 9:11-15; Hebrews 10:19-25 several times and make some general observations about the passage. List a few points as a result of your observations.
4. From what you heard in the sermon, and read in the text, what is the difference between the Old Testament sacrifices and the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross? Why was it important for the writer of Hebrews to clarify this reality? How would you explain this to a new believer trying to make sense of the Old Testament?
5. How does understanding the book of Hebrews help you to understand the Gospel more deeply? (think about all we have discussed over the last 4 weeks)
6. From what we have heard this week in Hebrews, what role does covenant community play when it comes to our continued endurance and perseverance in faith? (see Hebrews 10:19-25) How have key relationships helped you persevere in the past?
7. What might it look like to "consider how to stir up one another to love and good works...." within your weekly Home Group meeting? How could this become a more natural part of Home Group?
8. What points will stick with you as a result of this study? What new insights did you gain? What are some points of change for you personally as a result of hearing this message?
