

HOME GROUP QUESTIONS: 12/02/18

1. It was A.W. Tozer who said, “The most important thoughts we think, are the thoughts we think about God.” What attribute of God do you think is emphasized the most within the Christian community? What attribute of God is probably least thought about/discussed? Why do we lean more heavily in one direction?
2. What one or two statements from the message felt most important to you personally?
3. Read Isaiah 6:1-7 several times and make some general observations about the passage. List a few points as a result of your observations.
4. What emotions are present when you read through Isaiah’s vision of the Lord? In a concise way how would you describe Isaiah’s vision of God? How did he experience the Lord?
5. Proverbs 1:7 says, “The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge.” From hearing the message, what have you learned about the fear of the Lord? Why do you believe fear should be one of the ways in which we approach God? Where do you find yourself resisting this idea?
6. Notice Isaiah’s response in verse 5—what do you believe is the benefit of such a response when we approach God?
7. When seeing the Lord, Isaiah responded with deep sorrow. After Isaiah cried out, the seraphim touched his lips with a burning coal and proclaimed, “your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for” We can’t understand what we have been rescued from until we see how far we have fallen. What is the continued connection between godly sorrow and true, deep repentance?
8. Why is it so important for us to understand the word atonement? Describe how this leads us to worship and freedom?
9. What points will stick with you as a result of this study?
