Would you like anyone in particular to speak at your service?  What part of your life would they speak about?
What would your theme song be? Is there specific music you'd like played at your service?
Who had the biggest influence in your life?  Is there a way you'd like to honour that person?

- Where would you like the memorial/funeral to be held?
- Do you want a religious or non-religious ceremony?
- Flowers often play an important role in memorialisation.

What is your favorite flower? What is your least favorite flower?

- What personal objects would you like at your service? Photos, family heirlooms, recipes, memorabilia, sporting equipment? What is special to you?
- O Do you want to be buried or cremated?

What type of casket?

How do you want your cremated remains to be handled?

Where do you want your final resting place to be?
