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

Directives on a Eulogy

At this time of sorrow, it may be helpful for family and friends to remember their deceased loved one with fondness and love. This is a natural part of the grieving process. At our parish, we have provided the following directives to help answer any questions you may have regarding the appropriateness of the eulogy in the context of the funeral.

Based on the guidelines established by Archbishop John J. Myers, Archdiocese of Newark and our pastoral application, the eulogy may be delivered, if the family desires it, at **one** of these appropriate times:

- At the funeral home the evening before the funeral;
- · At the grave site after the Funeral Mass;
- At the repast (family gathering after the Mass/burial;)
- · In the church, before the Funeral Liturgy.
 - If this choice is selected, we ask that one person deliver the eulogy, which is to be limited to one typed, doublespaced page.
 - This is to be submitted to the presiding priest the day prior to the funeral, via fax 908-889-9477, email ihm123@aol.com, or delivery to the parish office in the Nazareth Center.

Old Testament Readings

A Reading from the Book of Proverbs 31:10-31

When one finds a worthy wife,

her value is far beyond pearls. Her husband, entrusting his heart to her, has an unfailing prize, She brings him good, and not evil, all the days of her life. She obtains wool and flax and makes clothe with skillful hands. She rises while it is still night, and distributes food to her household. She picks out a field to purchase; out of her earnings she plants a vineyard. She reaches out her hands to the poor, and extends her arms to the needy. She fears not the snow for her household: all her charges are doubly clothed. Her husband is prominent at the city gates as he sits with the elders of the land. She is clothed with strength and dignity, and she laughs at the days to come. She opens her mouth in wisdom, and on her tongue is kindly counsel. She watches the conduct of her household. and eats not her food in idleness. Her children rise up and praise her; her husband, too, extols her: "Many are the women of proven worth, but you have excelled them all." Charm is deceptive and beauty fleeting; the woman who fears the Lord is to be praised. Give her a reward of her labors, and let her works praise her at the city gates.

A Reading from the First Book of Kings 19:4-8

Elijah left his servant there and went a day's journey into the desert, until he came to a broom tree and sat beneath it.

He prayed for death:

"This is enough, O Lord! Take my life, for I am no better than my fathers.

The thought of my homeless poverty is wormwood and gall; Remembering it over and over leaves my soul downcast within me. But I will call this to mind, as my reason to have hope: The favors of the Lord are not exhausted, his mercies are not spent; They are renewed each morning, so great is his faithfulness. My portion is the Lord, says my soul; therefore will I hope in him. Good is the Lord to one who waits for him, to the soul that seeks him; It is good to hope in silence for the saving help of the Lord.

A Reading from the Book of Sirach 2:1-9

My child, when you come to serve the Lord, prepare yourself for trials. Be sincere of heart and steadfast, undisturbed in time of adversity. As gold in the furnace, he proved them, and as sacrificial offerings he took them to himself. Those who trust in him shall understand truth. and the faithful shall abide with him in love: Because grace and mercy are with his holy ones, and his care is with his elect.

A Reading from the Book of Wisdom 4:7-15

But the just man, though he die early, shall be at rest. For the age that is honorable comes not with the passing of time, nor can it be measured in terms of years, Rather, understanding is the hoary crown for men, and an unsullied life, the attainment of old age. He who pleased God was loved; he who lived among sinners was transported -Snatched away, lest wickedness pervert his mind or deceit beguile is soul; For the witchery of paltry things obscures what is right and the whirl of desire transforms the innocent mind. Having become perfect in a short while, he reached the fullness of a long career; for his soul was pleasing to the Lord, therefore he sped him out of the midst of wickedness But the people saw and did not understand, nor did they take this into account.

A Reading from the Book of Wisdom 7:7-11

Therefore I prayed, and prudence was given me;
I pleaded, and the spirit of Wisdom came to me.
I preferred her to scepter and throne,
And deemed riches nothing in comparison with her,
nor did I liken any priceless gem to her;
Because all gold, in view of her, is a little sand,
and before her, silver is to be accounted mire.
Beyond health and comeliness I loved her,
And I chose to have her rather than the light,
because the splendor of her never yields to sleep.
Yet all good things together came to me in her company,
and countless riches at her hands.

A Reading from the Second Book of Maccabees 12:43-45

He then took up a collection among all his soldiers, amounting to two thousand silver drachmas, which he sent to Jerusalem to provide for an expiatory sacrifice. In doing this he acted in a very excellent and noble way, inasmuch as he had the resurrection of the dead in view; for if he were not expecting the fallen to rise again, it would have been useless and foolish to pray for them in death. But if he did this with a view to the splendid reward that awaits those who had gone to rest in godliness, it was a holy and pious thought.

A Reading from the Prophet Ezekiel 34:11-12.15-16

For thus says the Lord God:

As a shepherd tends his flock
when he finds himself among his scattered sheep,

New Testament Readings

A Reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Romans 6:3-4.8-11

Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism in death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life. If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him. We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him. As to his death, he died to sin once and for all; as to his life, he lives for God. Consequently, you too must think of yourselves as being dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus.

A Reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Romans 8:14-18

For those who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God.

For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received a spirit of adoption, through which we cry,

Abba, "Father!"

The Spirit itself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if only we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him. A Reading from the 1st Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 2:1-6.9

When I came to you, my friends, proclaiming the mystery of God, I did not come with sublimity of words or of wisdom. For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified. I came to you in weakness and fear and much trembling, and my message and my proclamation were not with persuasive words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of spirit and power, so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God. Yet we do speak a wisdom to those who are mature, but not a wisdom of this age, nor of the rulers of this age who are passing away. But as it is written: "What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and what has not entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love him."

A Reading from the 1st Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 9:24-27

Do you not know that the runners in the stadium all run in the race, but only one wins the prize?

Run so as to win.

Every athlete exercises discipline in every way.

They do it to win a perishable crown,

but we an imperishable one.

Thus I do not run aimlessly;

I do not fight as if I were shadowboxing.

No, I drive my body and train it,

for fear that, after having preached to others,

I myself should be disqualified.

A Reading from the 1st Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 12:31-13:1-7

Strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts.

But I shall show you a still more excellent way.

If I speak in human and angelic tongues but do not have love,

I am a resounding gong or a cashing cymbal.

And if I have the gift of prophecy and comprehend all mysteries and all knowledge; if I have all faith so as to move mountains but do not have love, I am nothing.

If I give away everything I own, and if I hand my body over so that I may boast but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient, love is kind.
It is not jealous, nor pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered,

it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth.

It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

A Reading from the 1st Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 13:8-12

Love never fails.

If there are prophecies, they will be brought to nothing; if tongues, they will cease; if knowledge, it will be brought to nothing.

For we know partially and we prophesy partially, but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away.

When I was a child, I used to talk as a child, think as a child, reason as a child; when I became an adult, I put aside childish things.

At present we see indistinctly, as in a mirror, but then face to face.

At present I know partially; then I shall know fully, as I am fully known.

A Reading from the 1st Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 15:12-20

But if Christ is preached as raised from the dead, how can some among you say there is no resurrection of the dead? If there is no resurrection of the dead, then neither has Christ been raised. And if Christ has not been raised. then empty too is our preaching; empty, too, your faith. Then we are also false witnesses to God, because we testified against God that he raised Christ, whom he did not raise if in fact the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised. neither has Christ been raised, and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain; you are still in your sins. Then those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable people of all. But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.

A Reading from the 1st Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 15:20-26

But now Christ has been raised from the dead,
the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.
For since death came through a human being.
The resurrection of the dead came also through a human being.
For just as Adam all die,
so too in Christ shall all be brought to life,
but each one in proper order:
Christ the firstfruits;
then, at his coming, those who belong to Christ;
then comes the end,
when he hands over the kingdom to his God and Father,
when he has destroyed every sovereignty and every authority
and power.

For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet.

The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

A Reading from the 1st Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 15:51-57

Behold, I tell you a mystery. We shall not all fall asleep, but we will all be changed, in an instant, in the blink of and eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. For that which is corruptible must clothe itself with incorruptibility, and that which is mortal must clothe itself with immortality. And when this which is corruptible clothes itself with incorruptibility and this which is mortal clothes itself with immortality, then the work that is written shall come about: "Death is swallowed up in victory.
