• Made new appointments:


Yale Weiss (CUNY) was appointed Director in 2024 and Eno Agolli (Rutgers) was appointed Assistant Director in 2025.



Project spotlight: Oral Histories of Saul Kripke

What it is. A focused effort to record and transcribe first-person accounts about Saul Kripke-from students, colleagues, interlocutors, editors, and archivists-to document how his ideas were developed, debated, and taught.

Why it matters. Much of Kripke's influence lives in seminars, correspondence, and conversations. Capturing these memories now safeguards context that never appeared in print but is essential for historians of philosophy, logicians, and future students.
