ELJ104: Intermediate Japanese 2 (3 credits/4 hours)

- Aiming at JLPT level N4 or ACTFL Novice-High to Inter-Low (see https://bit.ly/45v6xal)

ELJ250: Japanese literature in translation (3 credits)
