Program of Study

Applicant must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and a major in a traditional science or at least 21 credits in one traditional science discipline (baccalaureate or latest degree). The balance of the science credits required for NYSED certification (36 credits, total, with a minimum of 30 credits of the 36 credits in one science) must be taken before a candidate is approved for certification. A minimum grade of B is required in 562 and student teaching.

Advanced Certificate Program in Science Education is a 24-credit graduate program which leads to initial certification to teach science in grades 7-12 in New York State.

This program is designed for candidates who have completed an undergraduate major in biology, chemistry, geosciences or physics. **However**, if students have already completed a minimum of 30 credits in college-level science courses in one science discipline (the equivalent of a science major) with a minimum GPA of 3.0, they are eligible to apply to the Advanced Certificate program.

A minimum overall undergraduate GPA of 3.0 and science GPA of 3.0 are required to enter and remain in the program. Candidates who do not meet this requirement may sometimes be permitted to enter as probationary matriculants. Probationary status will be removed when the first 12 credits of approved course work have been completed with a minimum average of B (3.0).

In addition to the general requirements for admission, a candidate must have two letters of recommendation to be admitted. GRE is not required.
