

#### WHY THIS TOPIC?


- We chose this topic because

#### Poverty:


· People that live in lower income areas tend to have higher risk for HIV since they cannot afford access to healthcare and transportation for treatment.






- We added a glossary because we figured the average teen wouldn't know some of the words.
