Currently, our existing facilities are outdated, and ill-equipped to meet the evolving needs of our students.



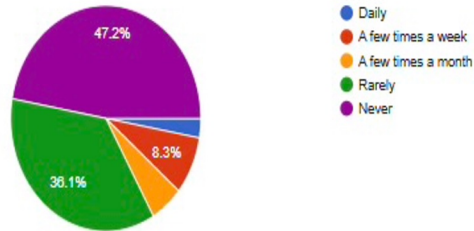
This proposal outlines a comprehensive plan for a new student center that will serve as a vibrant hub for campus life, supporting student success, and enhancing the overall college experience.

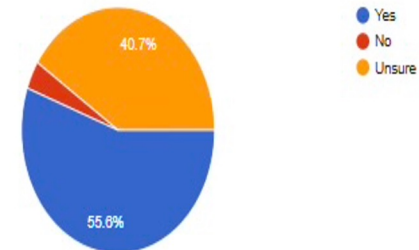
How often do you visit the student center?

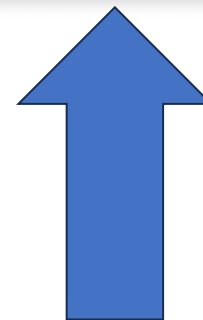

Break down the quad and. Add about 8 more square feet to the current student center building, gather materials

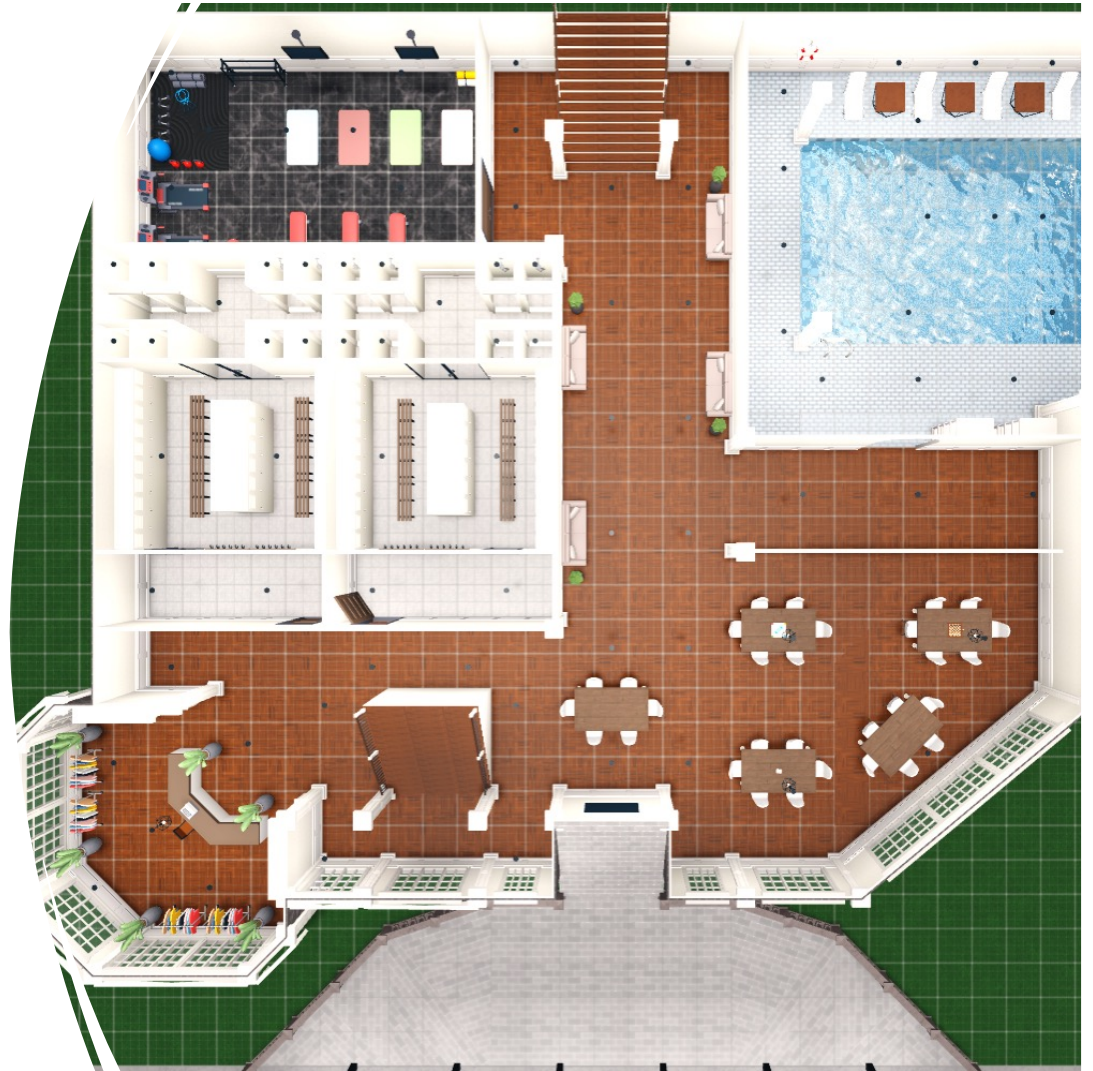
Phase 3:

Build, analyze and evaluate our student center !

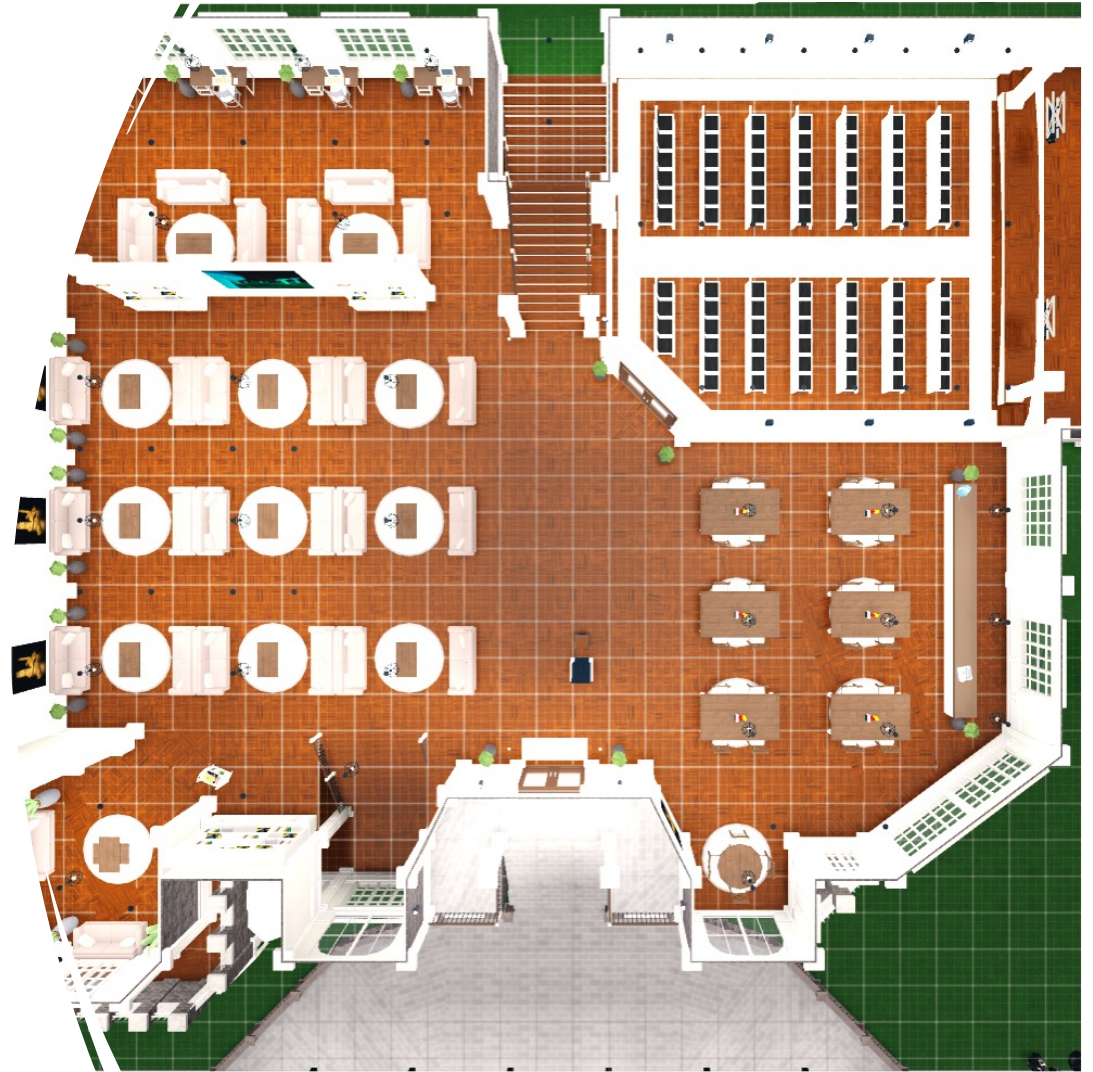
Floor 1- Sports

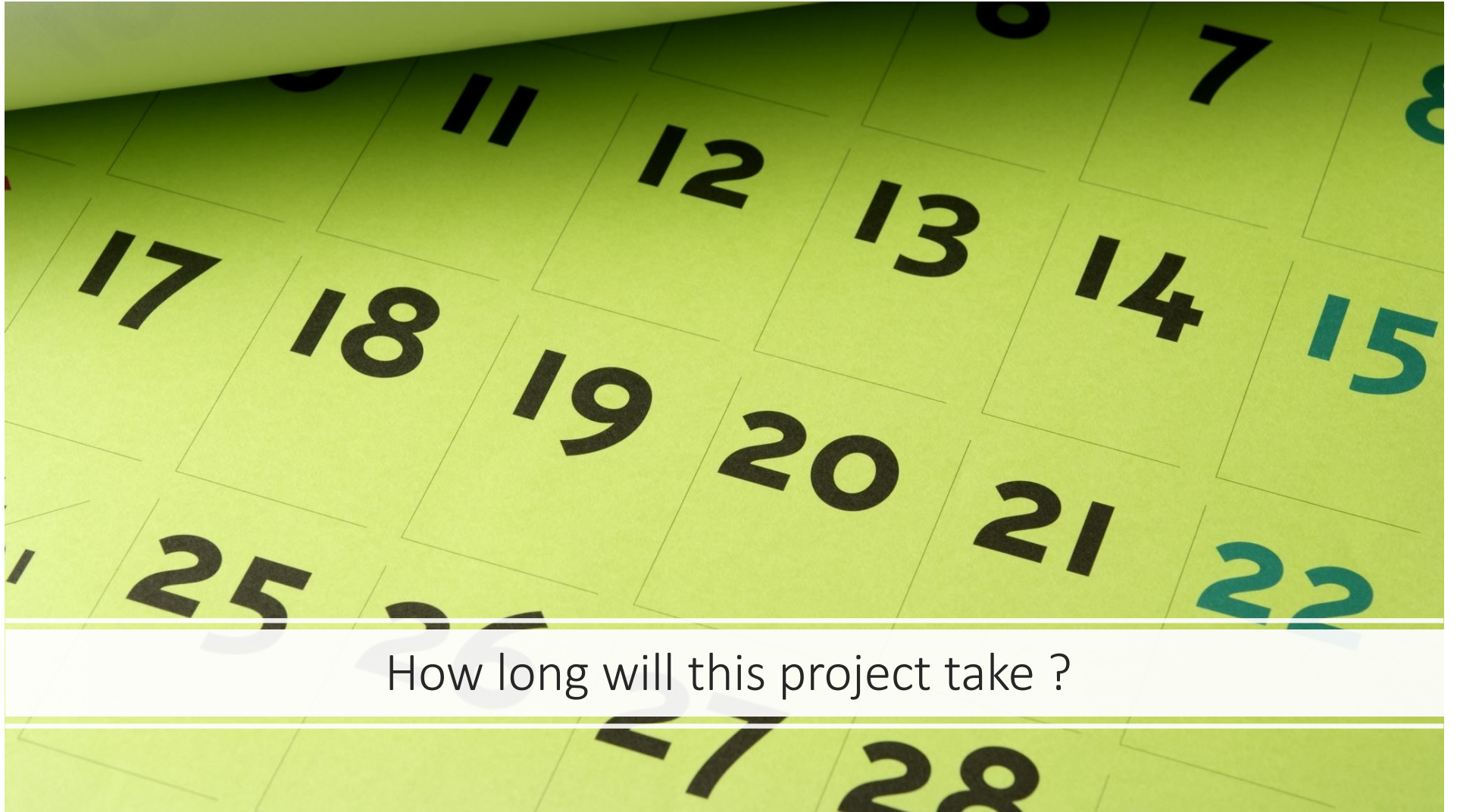


Cost & Benefits
