In the Matter of Orion Processing, LLC d/b/a World Law Processing, World Credit Repair and World Law Debt et al.– Case 15-23070-Civ-COOKE/TORRES

Background:

The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) alleged that World Law and its senior leaders ran a debt-relief scheme that charged consumers unlawful upfront fees and falsely promised consumers a team of attorneys to help negotiate debt settlements with creditors, failed to provide legal representation, and rarely settled consumers' debts. The orders entered in this matter permanently ban the defendants from participating in telemarketing or assisting others in telemarketing any consumer financial product or service, and from selling, advertising, offering, or providing any debt relief products or services.
