Welcome to the world of Scripture Picture Books! A fun and creative way to study the Bible with your children.

A Scripture Picture Book is a book of Bible verses from a specific passage of Scripture with one Bible verse on each page. Each page offers space to draw a picture that relates to the meaning of the Bible verse on that page.

Scripture Picture Books encourage children to read and listen to God's word, talk about God's Word, meditate on God's Word and picture God's Word in their minds and on paper. A completed Scripture Picture Book becomes a book to read and enjoy over and over again, savoring the beauty and wisdom of God's Word.

HOW TO CREATE A SCRIPTURE PICTURE BOOK

Pray: Before you begin, ask God to give you and your children understanding as you study His Word together.

Read: Read the passage of Scripture from your Bible.

Talk: Talk about each of the verses in the Bible passage. Ask questions that relate to the verses you are studying to help your children increase their understanding of the verses.

SUGGESTED QUESTIONS:

- What is this verse saying?
- What does _____ (choose a word) in this verse mean?
- What does this verse mean to you?
- What pictures do you see in your mind as you read and listen to this verse?
- What colors come to mind as you read and listen to this verse?

Draw: Give each child one Scripture Picture Book page. Provide a variety of colored pencils, markers, gel pens and/or crayons. Have each child draw a picture on their page that tells what the verse on their page is saying. Allow plenty of time for your children to draw and process their understanding of the verse on their Scripture Picture Book page. While drawing your children may have questions for you that relate to their individual verses. That's great! Their questions provide further opportunity to talk about the verse for more understanding of the verse.

Praise your children for efforts shown to think about, talk about and process each Bible verse. Also praise your children for taking the time to thoughtfully draw pictures that communicate what the verse is saying. (Your children's processing and understanding of God's Word is the focus here rather than their drawing skills.)


Make: Put the Scripture Picture Book together. Collect all the completed pages. Put the pages in order. Put the pages inside the provided front and back covers. Include the date and the ages of your children on the back cover. Staple the book together or put the pages in a notebook. (You may want to use page protectors if you are putting the pages into a notebook.)


Enjoy: Enjoy reading the Scripture Picture Book with your children. When you first read the book together, encourage your children to comment on their drawings as you read. This provides further opportunity for your children to continue to process their thoughts and understanding of each verse.



Pray: Thank God together for the wonderful truths discovered in the Scripture passage you studied.









10. And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people.


11. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord.
