






The Hunger Games


- o Twelve Districts and a Capitol Panem

- The entire reason the game take place is to show that the government is in control and without The Games the Districts would be nothing but disaster.

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
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




THE LOTTERY

- o It is more of a tradition rather than control.






Honor Killings?

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

The Action


The Action

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Government — Strict or Not Strict


