FRB Certification Option

You can become an FRB (Federal Reserve Bank) certified teacher on an economic topic by participating in an estimated 10 hours of lessons, readings, and online programming. There is no fee; simply register using the link at the bottom of this page.

Current courses for **FRB Certification** include:

- Unemployment
- Inflation
- Money
- The Federal Reserve and Monetary Policy
- GDP

Each course contains lessons, readings, and learning modules that you can use to teach the topic to students in your classroom. For each course, you will also need to complete both content and teaching assessments to obtain your certification.

Once registered, you will receive an email with instructions on how to join the course. Upon course completion, you will be awarded a certificate recognizing you as an FRB certified teacher!

Teaching Economics – Course Descriptions

Gross Domestic Product – This course will cover key content about gross domestic product (GDP), including what it measures, how it is measured, and how well it serves as an indicator for the health of an economy and the well-being of its citizens.

Inflation – This course will cover key content about inflation, including how it is measured, how it affects savers and borrowers, and why the Fed targets a low and stable rate of inflation.

The Federal Reserve and Monetary Policy – This course will cover key content about the Federal Reserve System and how the Fed conducts monetary policy to achieve the goals set for it by Congress—price stability and maximum employment.

Money – This course will cover key content about money, including the functions and characteristics that make it an effective tool within an economy.

Unemployment – This course will cover key content about unemployment, how it is measured, types of unemployment, and current unemployment data and trends.
