



# Energy East Oil Pipeline

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## PROJECT OVERVIEW

- ✿ A 4,600 kilometer pipeline from Alberta and Saskatchewan to refineries in Atlantic Canada.
- ✿ The pipeline will carry 1.1 million barrels of crude oil per day.
- ✿ The project will convert a section of existing natural gas pipeline to an oil transportation pipeline.
- ✿ On March 4, 2014, TransCanada submitted a project description to Canada's National Energy Board and is in the middle of filing regulatory applications.
- ✿ The exact route of the pipeline will be decided after public and regulatory review.
- ✿ This project will also include new tank terminals in Hardisty, Alberta, one in Saskatchewan, one in the Quebec City area and one in the Saint John, New Brunswick area.
- ✿ Marine tanker loading facilities will also be built at the terminals in Quebec City and Saint John areas for shipping to international markets.

## SIZE AND SCOPE

- ✿ The estimated total cost of the pipeline is CDN \$12 billion.
- ✿ The pipeline will be commissioned and in-service to Quebec by Q2-3, 2018 and to Saint-John by end of Q4, 2018.
- ✿ This project will create a busier refining industry in Eastern Canada with access to more reliable, competitively priced crude oil. This project will also reduce Canada's dependency on foreign oil.

## BEST PROSPECTS

- ✿ During the planning phase of the project, opportunities include:
  - Environmental and engineering studies
  - Survey services
  - Helicopter support
  - Specialized consulting activities
- ✿ During the construction phase of the project, opportunities include:
  - Specialized goods and services
  - A large amount of steel
