The Brexit vote in June of this year, pushed the UK into uncharted territory. What does the future hold for Britain politically and economically? This talk will discuss the governmental fallout, reaction in the business community, and the UK's new global narrative. It will also analyze the key negotiating points for Britain's departure from the EU, as well as tackle the medium and long-term outlook for the UK.

Tim Crouch is Vice Consul at the British Consulate in Los Angeles and heads the Creative and Digital Media team for the UK's newly-formed Department for International Trade in the United States. His team is responsible for foreign direct investment and UK export activity across film, television, advertising, video games, digital and social media, music, animation and design. He also leads strategic relationships with major investors in the entertainment industry across Southern California, Arizona, Nevada and Utah. Before joining the Department for International Trade, he was a senior policy advisor at the Cabinet Office in London. He has studied at the University of Bristol, Pitzer College and the University of Southern California. He has lived in Los Angeles for the past three years with his partner, Shatara who works in the film industry.
