Role Overview

The Campus Student Pastor (CSP) is responsible for overseeing the execution of fruitful ministry to junior high and high school students at a specific campus of The Chapel. This includes recruiting and training a volunteer Chapel Students Team to implement all aspects of this ministry. This person must provide excellent servant leadership, clear communication, vision, direction and motivation. He/She must embody The Chapel's culture and values by being third, expecting big, trusting big, being real and having fun, and share in the vision for every student to know and love Jesus, be led by the Spirit, share the Gospel and live on mission. This person must also serve on the larger CSP team to fight for unity and collaboration in making Chapel Students Chapel-wide a win!

General Requirements

The Campus Student Pastor must ...

- Understand and embrace the theology of inaugurated eschatology and its implications for followers of Christ
- Believe that the Holy Spirit indwells and empowers every follower of Jesus, and consistently experience the very power and presence of God at work inside, through, and around him/her as he/she participates in God's mission in the world
- Demonstrate a passion and aptitude for making disciples of Jesus and prioritize his/her life and ministry accordingly
- Share in the continued mission of Jesus by consistently ministering, through the power of the Holy Spirit, God's presence, love, truth, and power to all those he/she encounters
- Embrace genuine Christian community as the primary vehicle of discipleship at The Chapel
- Live a life defined by a revolutionary commitment to, and personal sacrifice for, the cause of Jesus Christ in the Kingdom of God
- Become a visible example and model for our congregation
- Be authentic, joyful, winsome, inspiring and compassionate
- Have exceptional formal and interpersonal communication skills
- Be an action-oriented leader with proven results

Primary Responsibilities

1. Lead the Chapel Students Volunteer Team
 - Partner with the Campus Pastor or Associate Campus Pastor to identify potential ministry team members and strategies
 - Inspire the Chapel Students Team to embody the vision and strategies of The Chapel's Student Ministry
 - Organize, equip and inspire the Chapel Students Team to serve according to their giftedness
 - Equip the Chapel Student Team to disciple students
 - Maintain an 8 to 1 student/volunteer ratio
2. Oversee Chapel Students Programming
 - Understand the vision and purpose of the weekly Chapel Students (junior and senior high) gatherings
 - Insure adequate preparation and implementation of Chapel Students' weekend and midweek programming
 - Participate in brainstorming and training meetings led by the Chapel Students Champion
 - Facilitate students' participation in campus and church-wide Chapel Students events, retreats, campus, etc.
3. Oversee the discipleship of students by ensuring that every student is known and loved by a mature Christ-following adult. This includes developing and cultivating an incarnational presence with students in their day to day environments, i.e. find organic ways for you and your team to hang out with students
4. Ensure clear, consistent communication with students, leaders and parents concerning Chapel Students happenings
5. Actively support and engage with the Chapel Students Champion and other CSPs to foster unity and collaboration toward The Chapel's Beliefs, Values and Vision among the entire leadership and volunteer team
6. Other campus responsibilities include:
 - Participation in scheduled Campus Team meetings
 - Participation in all Campus events
 - Visitations, counseling, weddings, funerals, etc. as needed
 - Other pastoral duties as assigned by the Campus Pastor and/or Associate Campus Pastor
