Community Evangelism!

Many have come to know Jesus as Lord and Savior this past month. It is our joy to share with you the new vision and direction the Lord has given to us. The medical clinic is a fabulous tool for drawing people to the Lord and the patients are so open to hearing the gospel. We have made it our new policy that every patient should be prayed for and presented with the gospel, no matter how busy we are. This first month has resulted in over 500 people asking Jesus for forgiveness of their sins and a new beginning in Christ. As a result our church is bursting at the seams with the new believers that live nearby now attending. Even more exciting has been the increase in miracles of healing among the sick. A snakebite victim was given 14 hours to live and was healed; a premature baby was given hours to live and went home healthy and happy after three days. A woman in labor and in need of emergency caesarean gave birth naturally and safely, mummy and baby are both fine. The number of malaria cases reduced significantly after we asked for prayer. Daily we are seeing miracles of healing and hope. Our greatest need is to get the right equipment to show the Jesus film to waiting patients, we need 2 screens and one DVD player costing about \$1,000 total in Nairobi. Our other great need is for the printing of tracts in Dinka, we have found it is a powerful tool even if people can't read because they ask us what it says!! That opens a door to share the tract and the gospel with them. This new outreach has made sharing the gospel more consistent than before and ensured that no patient leaves the clinic without being offered prayer. We faced opposition from the Ministry of Health but our quiet persistence has caused them to fade into the background and they no longer harass us.

Soccer Ministry!

Soccer is a major outlet for the youth in Sudan. This summer we brought in two Christian soccer coaches (one played soccer for Kenya) to help with a soccer outreach. We had more than 20 young men train as soccer coaches for their own hand-picked team. They learnt life skills and biblical principles as someone the younger generation look up to. The two week training ended with a final playoff between the two best teams, each one got a uniform to play in and was presented with medals and trophy cups. This is the first time they have ever been praised and valued with an award. It was such a joy to see them pray before playing (pictured) and use biblical lessons to influence something they all love. The community came out in support of the final game held in freedom square in the center of town. It was so touching to see them stand with hand on heart and sing their new national anthem. Incredibly they played for over an hour barefoot as if they had the latest and greatest soccer boots on! Our goal is to buy each one of them a pair of soccer boots, available in Kenya for just 600 ksh or \$8. With 22 teams and 13 kids on each team we are looking at \$2,200 to bless them all with new soccer boots. Please pray about being a part of helping us supply that need. Also if the Lord wills we plan to bring back one of the Kenyan coaches for a three month term to work alongside the youth for a longer period of time. In addition we would like to send two of the Sudanese coaches to Kenya for further training.
