Varsity Falls to the Long Pass

Tough Lowell came to Londonderry this past weekend in NEJHFL football action, with both teams sporting 2 and 3 records. Londonderry won the toss and after gaining one first down surrendered the ball to Lowell. Testing the middle of the line the Lowell Red Raiders succeeding in drawing in the Wildcat secondary. Then quickly moved to a play-action-pass for 30 yards and the 6 to 0 lead at the end of the first quarter.

After recovering a Wildcat fumble in the 2nd quarter the Red Raiders like the Red Barron took the air. On a very nicely run post pattern Lowell scored on a 46 yard TD bomb. They followed that score with a fake extra-point attempt passing for the 2 point conversion to make the score Lowell 15 Londonderry 0 at the end of the half.

Both teams struggled to move the ball in the 3rd quarter. From his secondary position Craig Santos lead the day with 8 solo tackles. Jacob Dionne, Elijah Proctor and Adam Wilkinson had 3 solo tackles each. Jake Mullen recorded a sack along with his 2 solo stops.

After a long drive that chewed up a lot of clock #24 Kevin Lyskawa scored the lone Londonderry TD to bring the cats close 6 to 15. Lowell answered on their next possession on another short pass play for the final score and the 21 to 6 victory.

Junior Varsity Come Back Attempt Stalls

It was never over until it was over. The game started off on quick back and forth set of scores. Lowell took the opening kick-off 39 yards down to the Wildcat 30. They scored on a 30 yard reverse play and with the EP run pulled ahead 8 to 0 after only 15 seconds !! Londonderry would quickly reply. On a drive that took just over two minutes #15 Evan Cormier took the ball the final 16 yards (AJ Thistle EP) to tie the score at 8.

Teams would battle for field position and Lowell, with only 31 seconds left in the half, would score on a 30 yard TD run. Josh Berube would stop the EP attempt and Lowell lead 14 to 8 at the half.

Lowell would capitalize on a Wildcat mistake and fumble on their first possession starting the 2nd half. Londonderry would fumble on their own 40 and Lowell would score on the next play. With the EP pass Lowell would quickly pull ahead 22 to 8. On their next possession Londonderry would pull closer. Evan Cormier connected on a 20 yard TD pass to #36 AJ Thistle (Ryan Dooley EP) to make the score Wildcats 16 Red Raiders 22. Striking gain quickly with speed Lowell would score on the KO return of 46 yards to pull ahead 30 to 16 with 4 minutes to play in the 3rd quarter. On a long drive that consumed nearly 8 minutes Londonderry would score on a 4th and goal from the 1 foot line pulling the Cats closer 24 to 30.

Lowell would wear down the clock with Londonderry getting the ball back with just under 2 minutes to play. Time would run out on the come from behind opportunity as the JV falls 30 to 24.

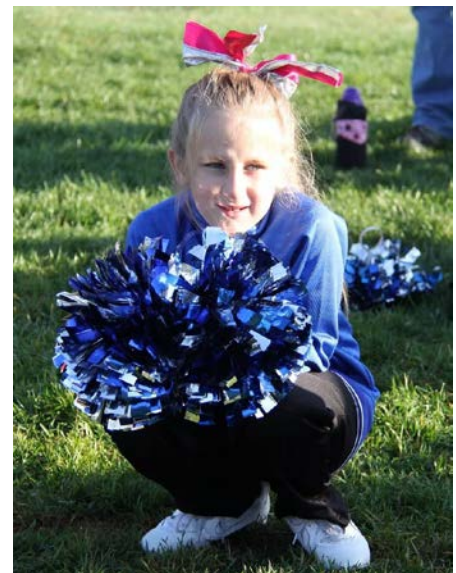
In the second quarter, Heenan
