Poway Lacrosse Club drops state final

The San Diego County champion Poway Lacrosse Club got to take a trip to San Francisco last weekend, but they didn't return with the souvenir they had gone up there hoping to get.

After beating Torrey Pines, 7-6, to take the county crown, Poway traveled to the Bay Area to face Skyline, the club champion from the San Francisco/Oakland area. On Saturday, Poway lost the state title by a 10-5 score and didn't get to bring home the first place trophy.

"The kids had a good time but, unfortunately, I think the excitement of the trip got to them," said Poway Coach Pete Larrabee. "I was disappointed in the outcome of the game because we were just a much better team than what we showed. We made fundamental errors and we just didn't play our game.

On Saturday, Poway got all five of its goals from seniors Roger Konia and Corey Carter.

Konia and Carter lead a large Poway contingent into this Saturday's San Diego County East-West All Star game, to be held at Coronado Cays at 3 p.m. Also participating on Larrabee's West team are defensemen Jason Wos, Grant Lohman and Dan Mansfield, midfielder Jeff Hughes and attackers Jeff Carmichael and Alex Bray.
