Boudreau Integrity Scholarship Criteria Statement

Establishment

This award, established on July 25, 2011 by the Loudoun Junior Golf Association (LJGA) Board of Directors, is to recognize association members who have grown up within the LJGA and exemplify the mission of the organization.

Criteria

1. Applicant must have played in LJGA for a minimum of three years with at least one of those years being in the Masters Division.
2. Applicant must be an active member of LJGA during the year of application.
3. Applicant must be a High School graduate or graduating senior and be admitted to a four year or two year College, University, or Institution. Documentation of acceptance is required.
4. Applicant must submit a completed Award Application by August 15, 2021 – page 2 below. The submission date will be adjusted annually to coincide with the end of tournament play.

Selection

The LJGA Board of Directors will appoint an annual committee of four Board Members to review applicants. The committee will select a recipient and notification will be made at the LJGA's Awards Banquet. The decision of the committee will be final.

Award

1. This award, in the amount of \$1000.00, will be given once annually and announced at the annual End of Season Banquet.
2. Additional awards of equal or lesser amounts may be given at the LJGA's discretion.
3. The award will be made to the recipient one time and is not renewable.
4. The award will be paid through the Cashier's Office of the recipient's selected College, University, or Institution and will be credited toward tuition payments. The recipient's student ID Number must be provided to the LJGA in order to process the award.
