SportsClub Blues earn top seed, again

The KC SportsClub Blues captured the top seed in the post-season tournament for the second year in a row, but it wasn't easy.

The Blues (23-5), edged the Milgram Mustangs for the top seed by just one game.

"The accomplishment was not without its struggles," Coach **Michael Moore** said. "With increased parity and outstanding play up and down the league, we often found ourselves in very close games.

"We have nothing but respect and admiration for all our opponents and know that the post-season tournament will once again be highly competitive."

Moore said that the keys to the Blues' success have been quality pitching, good defense and timely hitting.

The team had a team batting average of .296, a team ERA of 1.44 and a team fielding percentage of .958.

Moore pointed to three two-year players for their contributions to the 2013 team.

"**Robert Calvano** has been a two-year mainstay in our pitching rotation," Moore

said. "Robert pitched for Johnson County Community College this spring and will be moving on to the University of Nebraska-Omaha next school year.

"Robert enjoys the competitive nature of Ban Johnson and the convenience it affords players who need to work during the summer."

He said that outfielder **Alex Wilson** has been a two-year starter for the Blues and has a perfect fielding percentage.

"Alex enjoys being able to work in the morning, work out in the afternoon and play games in the evenings," Moore said of the Coffeyville CC player.

Infielder **CJ Faddis** was the 2012 Frank White Gold Glove winner.

The Coffeyville CC infielder views the wood bat experience as being instrumental in gaining additional plate presence Moore noted.

"His defense remains outstanding as he holds down the middle infield positions," Moore said.

45th All-Star Game set for Sunday at the K

The 45th Annual Ban Johnson League All-Star Game hosted by the Kansas City Royals is set for Sunday.

The first pitch is slated for 9 a.m. with the game completed at 11:30 a.m.

The 15-team league has been split into two teams - B and J.

Post-Season Tournament is set

The 2013 tournament is underway to decide this year's Ban Johnson League champion.

All games will be played at the Mid-America Sports Complex.

The first-round involves the bottom eight teams in the league playing for the eighth seed in the second and championship round.

Both tournaments will use a double-elimination format.

The eight teams in the first tournament competing for the eighth seed in the championship round are Building Champions, MSBL Royals, Natural Baseball Academy, Regal Plastics, MidAmericare Nationals, Midwest Orioles, the Bandits and the KC Barnstormers.

There will be four games on July 19, July 20 and July 22 with two games on July 23 and a single, if needed, on July 24.

The seven teams are already in the championship tournament are KC SportsClub Blues, Milgram Mustangs, BJ Raiders, Kansas City A's, UMB Bank, Seaboard and NKC Apartments.

With no rain problems in the first tournament, the championship double-elimination tournament will start with four games on July 25, July 26, July 27 and two on July 28 and one on July 29, if necessary.

In 2012, the KC SportsClub Blues rolled through the championship tournament undefeated becoming the first first-year team to win the Ban Johnson League title.

It will be an experience that will be in the memories for the players for many years to come.

What do some former players say about their experience in the All-Star Game?

Paul England of Butternut Bread won the MVP in the 1982 All-Star Game:

"I gained a lot of respect for the major league ball players playing on the artificial turf back then," he said. "It was the game at 10 a.m. in the morning on the turf was over 100 degrees even then," he said. "I am a young kid in great shape with lots of energy and by the end of the fifth inning I was wore out because of the heat."

He said of winning the MVP, "nothing could be more exciting."

He got to play in more than one All-Star Game.

"Playing in the All-Star Game the second time and getting a hit and stealing two bases," he said. "The next time I got on, the third base coach was trying to help me win the MVP award for the second time and wanted me to steal again. I got picked off first base. That was embarrassing."

Steven Roldan of Regal Plastics won the MVP honor in the 1998 game.

And he has a lot of memories of his experi-

ence at Kauffman Stadium.

"Hitting a home run at Kauffman Stadium with my mom and dad there to see it. That was pretty awesome," he said. "And getting coached by mentor and father figure Rob McFarlane, If it wasn't for him I wouldn't have had a chance to play in the league."

Dave Goodwin of the Milgram Mustangs got to play in four All-Star Games, but that isn't his biggest memory of the games.

His big memory comes out of the 1983 All-Star Game as an eight-year old. His older brothers Steve and Mark were playing in the game.

"Coach (**Don**) **Motley** invited me into the dugout prior to the game so that I could participate as the bat boy," he said. "As the All-Star Game progressed, many of the Royals players began to filter into the dugout and before long, I was filling a baseball full of autographs from the likes of George Brett, **Frank White**, Hal McRae and Willie Wilson among other Royal greats."

And does he still have that baseball?

"That baseball still sets proudly in a case in my office," he said. "I would go on to play for Coach Motley, whom I am grateful for this and many other opportunities that he provided me."

Goodwin was the MVP of the 1996 All-Star Game.
