

Guidelines for *The Journal* by The Society for Classical Learning

We invite article submissions that provide *original* and *unique* work in the area of classical Christian education and adjacent subject areas. Original work should *not* have been published elsewhere, in whole or in part, and it should *not* be under consideration elsewhere, in whole or in part, without the consent of the editor. Unique work should offer a decisive contribution to *The Journal* and it should show the significance and relevance to classical Christian education at large. We honor scholarship that exhibits carefully honed content, molded by an effective organization of thoughts and arguments, and which is communicated in a readable and nuanced style.

We encourage you to ‘pitch’ an article idea before submitting a paper, please contact the Editor for more information.

General Style Requirements for Articles:

- **STYLE:** Submissions must follow *The Chicago Manual of Style* (16th ed.) and it should be in twelve-point font, double-spaced with one-inch margins.
 - **Heading** should be at the top of the page, left justified, and include: author’s name, affiliated organization (school, publisher, company), and date submitted.
 - **Title** should be centered, bold, and italicized after heading.
- **REFERENCES:** All references should be in footnotes (also double-spaced).
- **SUBMISSION METHOD:** Contributors should send a manuscript, saved as a Microsoft Word file through our online submission form:
 - Please fill out all required parts of the submission form.
- **ABSTRACT:** Authors should also be prepared to submit an abstract for their article.
 - How and why will your submission contribute to *The Journal*, SCL, and CCE at large?

Articles:

- **DESCRIPTION:** Articles offer an original thesis and thought that uniquely contributes to classical Christian education. Articles should be focused in their scope, decisive in their contribution, and interact with relevant primary and secondary source material.
- **LENGTH:** The preferred length of articles is between 2,000 and 4,000 words.

We reserve the right to edit for usage and style. All accepted submissions are subject to editorial modification and communication between the Editor and contributor regarding these edits are as needed.
