



WORTHINGTON HIGH SCHOOL

Florida Statutes, Section 1008.341 provides for schools that serve at-risk students with dropout prevention and academic intervention services to receive a School Improvement Rating (SIR) instead of the A-F School Grade received by regular or zoned high schools.

The SIR rating is calculated based on student Learning Gains versus percentage scoring at high proficiency as measured by the standard A-F School Grades system.

School improvement ratings are assigned to schools based on the percentage of total applicable points earned as follows:

- Fifty (50) percent of total applicable points or higher equals a rating of “Commendable;”
- Twenty-six (26) to forty-nine (49) percent of total applicable points equals a rating of “Maintaining;” and
- Twenty-five (25) percent of total applicable points or less equals a rating of “Unsatisfactory.”

In order for a school to be assigned a SIR rating, it must have at least 10 students with assessment scores in reading/English Language Arts and/or math for the current and prior year.

Worthington High School was assigned a SIR rating of “COMMENDABLE.”
