



**READ MARK 10:45**

**DAY 1**

*Parents*

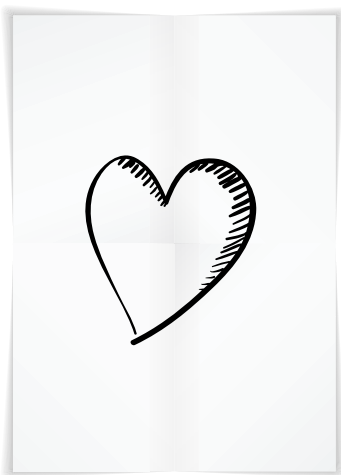
*Teachers*

That was kind of a trick question—because you should have circled them all! Whether you’re a king, a princess, a waiter, a doctor, or “just a kid,” you can serve others. The King of Kings, the Savior of the world, humbled himself, so there’s no reason WE can’t serve others!

**READ 1 JOHN 4:19**

**DAY 2**



God loved us first, so we can love others by showing them what God’s love looks like!

Grab a sheet of paper and tear off a small corner. Using a pencil, draw a heart, coloring it in as darkly as you can. Then take the piece of paper with the heart to the sink and wet the back of it. Press the piece of paper down on the back of your hand, and hold it tightly for a few seconds. Peel it off, and voila! You’ll have a temporary tattoo of a heart to remind you that you can love and serve others just like God first loved and served you!

**KNOW** that we can share the love God has shown us to others!

## READ JOHN 15:12-13

DAY 3

Jesus served the disciples by washing their feet, but that was not even close to the biggest act of service He would perform. Eventually, Jesus would serve all of humanity by dying on the cross to pay the price for our sins. Thankfully, we don't have to give up our lives to serve each other, but we may have to give up other things, like . . .

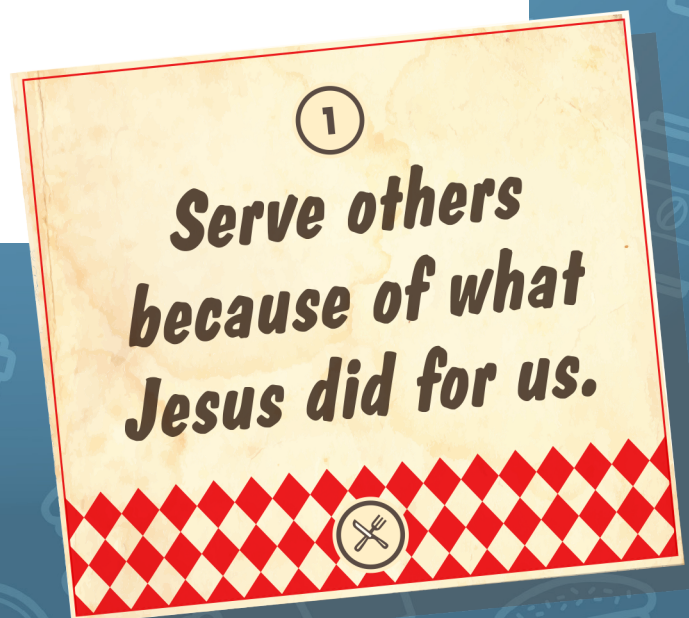
**ASK** God to help you give up whatever it takes to serve others well.

## READ GALATIANS 6:2

DAY 4

When Jesus died on the cross for us, He took on our sin, and paid the price for it. We can't carry the load of others' sin, but we can help them carry other things that are hard. Whether it's actual things they are carrying (like helping your parent bring in the groceries or take the trash outside), or doing something to lighten their load in other ways, like helping your sibling with their chores or taking time to cheer them up when they're having a bad day. Walk around your house for a minute and find something that someone else is carrying, and take that load from them.

**LISTEN** and look for ways you can serve others like Jesus served you.





**READ ISAIAH 58:10**

**DAY 1**

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Have you ever been really hungry before? So hungry you got grumpy? You may have even said, "I'm starving!" But were you ACTUALLY starving? Probably not. Thankfully most of us won't experience true starvation. However, there are people in our country and around the world who truly may go hungry if someone doesn't help them. Thankfully there are food pantries in your community that provide food for people who are truly hungry. With your parents' permission, either raid your own family's pantry or make a grocery list for some items you can buy and donate to a food pantry this week!

**ASK** God to take care of and provide for the person who will receive your food.

**READ EPHESIANS 2:10**

**DAY 2**

We were made to serve! That means our ears were meant to hear others' needs, our eyes were meant to see others' needs, our feet were meant to take us to others in need, and our hands were meant to help them!

Today, keep your eyes and ears open to listen and look for a need that you can meet. Then use your feet and hands to meet the need.

**LISTEN** and look for ways to serve others.






## READ ROMANS 12:10-13

DAY 3

In order for you to share with people who are in need, first you need to see their need. Sometimes that means we have to get outside of our normal routines, meet people other than our regular friends and peers, and look for people who we can serve. Then again, sometimes people who need our help are right under our noses. But we'll never know if we aren't looking for ways to serve others, which often means we need to stop focusing on ourselves and what we want.

Take a dry erase marker and make a big  symbol on your bathroom mirror. Leave it up for a few days to remind yourself that sometimes you need to stop looking at yourself and what you need, and look for ways to serve others.

**KNOW** that you have to look at someone besides yourself to find ways you can serve others.



## READ 1 JOHN 3:18

DAY 4

Have you ever looked at someone in need and felt bad for them, but not done anything about it? If so, you haven't shown them love, have you? Love isn't a feeling; it's an action. And when you serve others, you're showing them REAL love!

**S**et the table for dinner.

**E**-mail, text or call someone with some encouragement.

**R**un ahead of someone to hold the door for them.

**V**isit a grandparent, older relative, or friend and help them around the house.

**E**at with someone who is sitting alone.

**LISTEN** God to help you continue to look for ways to serve others.





## READ LUKE 3:10-11

DAY 1

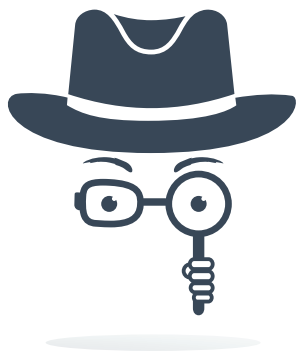






## READ PHILIPPIANS 2:4

## DAY 1



Have you ever done something nice just so everyone would see you do it and think you're awesome? Or maybe you didn't do it for everyone to see, but you certainly wanted the person you were serving to notice. If we're being honest, probably all of us have done that at some point.

Today, put on your undercover detective hat (imaginary, of course), and try to serve as many people as you can without them or anyone around them seeing. You'll probably find you have one of your best days ever when you serve others in secret.

**KNOW** that serving in secret is actually more fun than seeking applause!

## READ MATTHEW 5:16

## DAY 2

Matthew 5:16 may seem like it's contradicting what we're talking about this month. If we let our light shine so others can see it and see the good things we do, isn't that the opposite of serving in secret? Sort of, but the difference is in our intention. If we are serving others for praise and trying to draw attention to the good things we are doing so people will think we are awesome, that's not good. If people notice what we are doing, and we make sure they know we're serving others because God served us first, that's awesome! It shows others how Jesus has changed our lives, and it might make them want to know more about the God we serve!

## READ MATTHEW 6:3

DAY 3
