Letting someone know you see how valuable they really are

BOTTOM LINE: Honor others by giving them a chance.

Read Philippians 2:3



DAY 1 I See You!

This month is all about honor! Honor is letting someone know you see how valuable they really are. Let's make binoculars to help us find who we need to honor this week!

Grab a piece of paper, scissors, tape, and something to draw with.

1. Take one piece of paper cut it in half widthwise to create two equal size pieces of paper.
2. Roll up each piece separately, leaving enough space in the middle to see through it (like binoculars) and tape them up along the seam.
3. Set them next to each other and tape them together to make a set of binoculars!

Once you are finished, pick them up and take a look through them! Use these binoculars to look around and help you to see others who are often overlooked!

*Save these binoculars for this week!



DAY 2 God, Help Me See

Grab your binoculars from yesterday's activity. Take a few minutes and pray, asking God to help you see people who could often be overlooked by others. You can pray something like this and fill in the blanks with someone you think needs to be seen.

"Dear God, help me see people who are sometimes overlooked. I pray for, _____, today. God, give me a chance to show them how much You love them by what I do. Thank You, God. Amen."

Know that God can use you to help others.



DAY 3 Don't Overlook the Tricky Words!

Read this week's verse looking through your binoculars.

WOW! Some of those words are tricky. Let's break it down. Grab something to write with and trace the arrows below from the right to the left while reading aloud to match up the words and definitions. Once you are finished breaking it down say the verse above aloud again. Makes more sense, right?

Selfish ambition means -----> Putting yourself before others.

Vain conceit means -----> Doing things just because it makes us look good.

Humility means -----> Not thinking you are better than others.

Thank God for these words that can guide you on how to treat others.



DAY 4 The Not Overlooked Challenge

For your final task this week, you are challenged to show someone else that you see them. Talk with an adult and decide who you are going to "see" in the coming days and how you can show them honor. Some ideas are: ask the kid at school to play with you at recess or sit with you at lunch. If it is someone in your neighborhood, write them a card or bring them some cookies. Whoever you and your adult decide to "see" let them know why you are doing this (it's because God loves them!)

Adults: Talk with your child about one person that they can do something special for this week. Talk to them about what would be appropriate for that person, what they can do and say to best care for that person. Allow them to come up with an idea but, of course, just do whatever you can.

Ask God to help you show others how much He loves them by taking care of them.

BOTTOM LINE: Honor others by putting them first.

Read Philippians 2:4

DAY
1

Others First

On a separate sheet of paper, make a prayer list of a few people that are closest to you and add your name to the very bottom of the list. Take some time now and pray to God. Pray for everyone else first and finish by praying for yourself. You can pray something like this:

"Dear God, Thank You so much for the people You put in my life. Thank You for (list their names). I pray that I can be there for them and work on putting them before myself. I also pray that You will give me chances to show them that I love them by putting them first! Thank You, God. Amen."

Ask God to show you ways that you can put others first.

2

You're It!

Gather some friends and play a game of Duck-Duck-Goose. Play normally, but the trick part about this game is that you can't be it first to be the caller! Encourage one of your friends to go first and be the leader. Of course, you can go if you get chosen or win the round, but start off by letting someone else go before you!

Know that putting others before yourself shows them how valuable they really are.

Honor Another

Take a few minutes and think of a way that you can honor someone you know. Think of a way you can show a parent, teacher, or friend that you care about them. Circle an idea from below that you will do or write down your own idea:

Read Philippians 4:19

DAY 1

I Got It!

Think of someone in your home that could use a little break. Go to that person and ask them if you can do something for them this week. After finding out what task you can do, set a day for you to complete this task for them! Before you leave them, say: "I promise to help you and I will honor you by keeping my promise." Work hard this week to complete the task you were given for that person.

Ask God to help you keep your promise.

DAY 2

His Promises

Read this week's verse, **Philippians 4:19**. Did you know that if you believe in God He will ALWAYS keep His promises to you? Some promises God gives us are listed in the verse you just read. Do you know some other promises God made to us? Below are just a few of the many promises God made us. Can you think of another? Write it in the space below.

DAY 3

Promise Keeper

Grab some paper and something to draw with. Draw a picture of yourself keeping your promise. In your drawing, draw the person you made the promise to and yourself doing what you promised! Somewhere on your paper write this week's bottom line: Honor others by keeping your promises.

Look for ways that you can honor others this week.

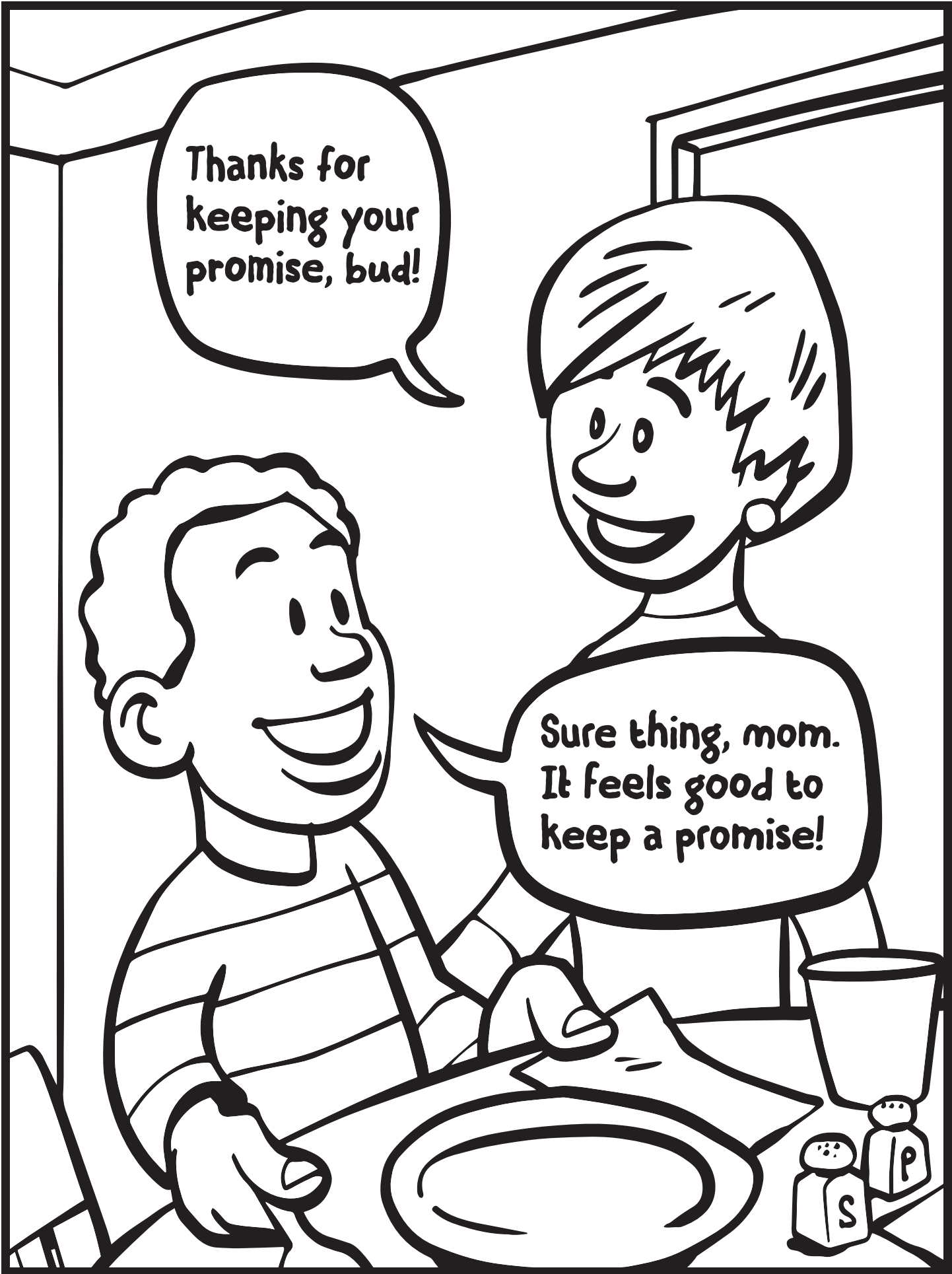
DAY 4

DAY
1

God Never Changes

Read this week's Bible verse, **James 1:17**. Now, go grab a flashlight and find a dark spot. If it is daytime, a closet or your basement might work.

Turn on the flashlight in the darkness. Using your hands, create shadows on the wall or ceiling. If you are with someone else, take turns creating shadows and guessing what they are. Although the shadows you made kept changing, God never changes! He promises to stay that same forever!

Know that God does not change.

2

Credit Card!

God gives us everything we need! Think of a way God has taken care of one of your needs. Did He put food on your table or provide friends to play with? Take out a piece of paper and something to draw with. Fold that paper in half to make a card. Inside the card, draw a picture of the need God recently met. Inside of the card write the words, "Thank You, God!" After you are finished put this in a safe place to use again tomorrow.

Look for ways that God takes care of you every day.

3

Give Him Credit

Yesterday you wrote God a card thanking Him for what He has given you. Today, you get to talk to God and thank Him for what He has done. Grab your card from yesterday and thank God for whatever you drew on your card. Pray something like this:

"Dear God, thank You so much for

4

Share the Good!

God has given you so much and we can honor Him by sharing with others. Sit down with your parent and think of a way that you can take care of someone else today. Some ideas that might work are: donating old toys to a kid who can use them, drawing someone a beautiful picture and delivering it to them, or sitting down and praying with a friend.

Adults: This could be something super involved like cleaning out old toys and donating them to someone else or it can be as simple as helping your child create a drawing that will brighten someone's day. Think together of someone and something that you can do special for them. Remind your child that they are honoring God when they take care of others!

Ask God to give you opportunities to show others that He cares for them by meeting their needs.

Draw a gift you would like to give to someone.
