Too Hard for Me

Elijah had something that felt really hard to do—he poured water all over an altar that needed to catch fire! But God did the impossible!

Have you ever felt like something was too hard? Draw something that feels too hard for you.



Now, with a different color crayon, write the word GOD on top of your picture. God is with you even when things are hard. God can do the impossible!

Fire on Wet Wood?!

Elijah didn't light the fire himself. He prayed to God, and God sent fire from heaven! That's impossible for us, but not for God. When things feel too big or scary, remember that God is with you and he can help you do things that feel impossible. God is bigger than anything that is happening around us.

Inside the Fish

Elijah wanted everyone to know that only God can do impossible things. He told people to pour water all over the wood. Once. Twice. Three times! Soon, everything was dripping wet. Could that wood catch fire? No way!

But Elijah knew something important: God is big and strong. He can do anything, even make soaked wood burn! And when Elijah prayed, fire came down from heaven. Whoa!

ASK a grown-up: "What big thing do you trust God to do?" Pray together and tell God you trust Him to do impossible things!

God Can!



Elijah trusted that God would help him, and God did! God sent fire AND rain. That's amazing. When something feels impossible in your life, you can talk to God. He hears you. God is with you, and He can help in surprising ways!

"Dear God, You are big and strong. Thank You for helping Elijah and showing Your power. Thank You for helping me, too. Please help me when things feel too hard. I know You can do the impossible! I love You, Amen."

Wrong Way, Jonah!

Or you disobeyed and did something that your grown-up told you not to do. God knew what Jonah needed to do, and even when Jonah messed up, God didn't give up on him. God knows what's best, even when we go the wrong way.


God's Best Plan


Read: Daniel 6:22 NIrV


Safe and Sound

Queen Esther realized there was a problem; God's people needed help. She decided to do something for God's people, and she needed to talk to the king about it!

Right Place, Right Time

Esther heard Haman's terrible plan to hurt God's people. She felt scared, but she remembered God made her queen for a reason. Esther was reminded by Mordecai that she was in the right place to help! Before visiting the king, Esther asked everyone to pray for three days. God gave Esther courage, and Esther stood up for God's people. When someone needs help, ask God first, then use your hands and words to act. God loves when you help others.

ASK God for courage to help someone!


Saved Stories

Start the Wall!

Nehemiah heard Jerusalem's wall was broken. Nehemiah prayed, trusted God, and asked the king for help. When something seems so big, like sounding out tough words or tidying a messy room, God can help you!

One Stone at a Time

Nehemiah saw the broken wall. Nehemiah knew that God wanted him to fix it so, Nehemiah gathered everyone and encouraged them to rebuild the wall! So many people decided to help do that, even people who knew nothing about building a wall. They trusted God and chose one stone, then another. Soon, the wall rose.

Big tasks, like learning to swim, or cleaning the park, grow the same way: one brave step after another. God helps with each small job until the big job is done.



Keep Going!

Some people laughed at Nehemiah and tried to stop him. Nehemiah didn't quit, he kept laying stones until the wall was tall and strong. When something feels hard, like tying your shoes or practicing a new sport, God can give you courage to keep going.

Other people may not think you can do it. You might not even think you can do it. But God knows that you can with His help.

In only fifty-two days, Nehemiah's crew placed the last stone! There were so many people who trusted God and chose to build! God helped them turn a pile of broken rocks into a strong wall. When you face something that feels so big, remember the finished wall. God is stronger than any problem, and He will stay with you until the job is done.
