THINK ABOUT THIS

Tonight we kick off camp by talking about God's view of us—not as failed experiments, mistakes, or people who have to earn His approval, but as His royal creation made in His image. Many of our students walk into camp carrying labels placed on them by friends, parents, social media, their failures, or even themselves. Before they can understand what it means to live differently, they need to understand who they are and whose they are. Our hope is that students leave tonight believing that if God calls them chosen and valuable.

Icebreaker

If you could instantly become famous for one thing, what would you want to be known for?

- 1.** The message talked about being part of God's royal priesthood. When you hear that God calls you chosen and part of His family, what's your first reaction?
- 2.** A lot of people build their identity around sports, grades, popularity, relationships, appearance, or achievements. What do students your age most often look to for their identity?
- 3.** Be honest—what's a label you've been given by someone else or have given yourself that is hard to shake?
- 4.** God sees you as chosen, valuable, and loved. Which of those is hardest for you to believe about yourself right now? Why?
- 5.** What is one area of your life where your actions don't always match who God says you are?
- 6.** Is there a situation, friend group, or environment where it's hardest for you to live like someone who belongs to Jesus?
- 7.** If you fully believed that God chose you, loves you, and has a purpose for your life, what do you think would change about the way you live?
