THINK ABOUT THIS

Our students are constantly being told to trust themselves, follow their feelings, and put their own desires first. Because of that, trusting God can feel unnatural, risky, or even impossible. One of the most powerful things you can do as a leader is share a personal story of a time when God asked you to trust Him with something difficult. Be honest about your fears and doubts, but also point to God's faithfulness on the other side of your obedience. Students need to see that following Jesus isn't always easy, but it is always worth it.

- 5.** The disciples left everything to follow Jesus. What's one thing you're holding onto right now that you sense God is asking you to surrender?
- 6.** If you truly believed that Jesus was calling you into something better, what is one specific step of obedience you need to take this week?
- 7.** Tonight's theme is "I'm Different." How would your life look different if you fully embraced your identity as someone chosen by God and called to follow Jesus?
