

Senior Launch Retreat – FAQ

What is the Senior Launch Retreat?

The Senior Launch Retreat is a weekend experience designed exclusively for graduating seniors. It's a time to celebrate your accomplishments, deepen your faith, and prepare for the next steps in life. You'll reflect on your journey so far, receive practical tools for success, and form lasting connections with your peers and leaders.

Where will my student stay?

Your student will be staying at Wilstem Wildlife Park in Paoli, Indiana, which offers multiple separate cabins onsite for accommodations. Students will be housed by gender in separate cabins, and all meals and teaching sessions will take place in The Barn located on the property which will serve as a common area. Please note that due to the available accommodations, students may be required to share a queen or king bed with another student.

What activities will be included?

The weekend will feature a mix of activities including time in beautiful cabins, a wildlife safari experience, fun at a laser tag and miniature golf facility, plenty of time playing games and laughing with others, and powerful teaching sessions. You'll also participate in group discussions and activities aimed at helping you maintain your faith and build meaningful relationships in the years ahead.

What is covered in the cost?

The cost of the retreat covers all food, transportation, retreat materials, housing, the cost of all excursions.

How will the retreat help prepare for life after high school?

The retreat is designed to equip you with the tools and support needed to navigate the challenges of adulthood. Through sessions on faith, relationships, and personal growth, your student will leave with a clearer vision for their future and a strong sense of community.

When will students depart and return from the retreat?

Students will depart for the retreat on Friday, January 16, 2025. Check-in will begin at 4:30 PM at Connection Pointe Brownsburg, and students will depart for Wilstem Wildlife Park at 5:30 PM. They will return to Connection Pointe Brownsburg on Sunday, January 18, 2025, at approximately 5:30 PM for the Breakthrough Worship and Prayer Night.

What should I bring to the retreat?

A packing list will be provided closer to the event, but in general, please plan to bring clothing for each day, personal toiletries, and anything else you may need to be comfortable during the weekend. Bedding and towels will be provided by the property managers, so there's no need to bring those. Be sure to pack for a variety of activities, including outdoor adventures, and plan accordingly for cooler weather.

Retreat Packing List:

- **Clothing:**
 - Casual clothes for everyday wear
 - Appropriate clothing for Indoor and Outdoor Activities (temperatures may vary, so be prepared for cold weather)
 - Pajamas
 - A pair of comfortable shoes
- **Toiletries:**
 - Toothbrush and toothpaste
 - Shampoo, conditioner, and soap
 - Deodorant
 - Any personal medications
- **Miscellaneous:**
 - Bible, journal, pen
 - A reusable water bottle
 - Warm hat and gloves (if weather calls for it)
 - A small backpack or bag for carrying personal items

To limit distractions so students can fully connect with God and their peers upon arrival to Wilstem Wildlife Park, students' phones will be collected and kept in a secure room. Phones will be returned to students during excursions each afternoon and then recollected once back at cabins. On Sunday morning, all phones will be returned to students when we check out of cabins.
