Packing

Packing List

- Bible
- Notebook and pen/pencil
- Clothing for four days
- 2 sets of clothing for days 2, 3, and 4 (one set of clothing for each day should be suitable for getting wet/dirty)
- Sleepwear
- Jeans and a lightweight jacket for the possibility of cool evenings
- Appropriate swimwear (girls—one piece or tankini only, guys—no speedos)

What Not to Bring

- Cell Phones
- Large Electronics- no gaming devices, iPads, or similar, etc.
- Weapons- no knives, guns, blow-darts, slingshots, air soft guns, bb-guns, paint ball guns, bow/arrow, sword, crossbow, switchblades, brass knuckles, fireworks, biochemical or thermonuclear devices, etc.

- Illegal substances- no alcohol, vapes, or tobacco of any kind, or other drugs.

Packing Instructions

Because of the number of students, these are the packing guidelines that will enable us to organize our luggage and ensure a prompt loading/unloading process. Please follow them carefully and thank you in advance for your cooperation. Students are permitted to bring three luggage items.

- 1 Medium Suitcase or Bag with your name clearly marked on the outside
- 1 Bedding Bag for your pillow, sleeping bag/blanket, sheets (twin size)
 - This should be a large, plastic garbage bag with your name on the side in large, clear lettering written on a piece of duct tape.
 - Include an extra plastic bag for the return trip.
- 1 Backpack (This should be small so that it can be carried onto the bus and kept in your student's lap or on the floor of the bus)

Medications

While we do not anticipate any injuries, minor injuries can sometimes occur.

We're excited to have two awesome nurses on site: Nurses Liza Maricle, Kaylesha Burch, and Kayla Lents. They'll be available to assist with any health-related concerns that may come up, and they'll also be overseeing the distribution of medications and OTC needs throughout the week. All medications that must be taken as prescribed should be administered by visiting the Camp Infirmary, located in the Dining Hall, during Breakfast, Lunch, and Dinner times. For easy identification, all nurses will be wearing CP Student crossbody bags—so if you need help, you'll know just who to look for!

Our Nurses will also be handling any and all prescription medications, other than such things as an EpiPen or inhaler that a child would normally keep with them. If your child has any prescription medication that needs to be administered during the event or over-the-counter medication that a parent prefers the adult leader to administer, please bring those medications to check-in with only the necessary dosing required for the duration of the event. Please clearly label the packaging so that it includes your child's full name and dosing instructions.

Food and Dietary Restrictions

All meals are provided by SpringHill Camps. If your student has food allergies or dietary restrictions, please notify our team by May 5th, so we can work with the camp to accommodate their needs.

CP Students Camp Rules

1. Respect others and yourself.
2. No guys in girls' cabins and vice versa.
3. Alcohol, tobacco, vaping, drugs, and weapons are absolutely prohibited.
4. Must be in assigned cabin by the designated "In Cabin Time" on the schedule.
5. Follow the schedule. Be where you are supposed to be when you are supposed to be there.
6. Do not leave the auditorium once the speakers begin talking.
7. Respect the campus – no TP, water balloons, shaving cream, sidewalk chalk, etc.
8. No practical jokes.
9. No deliveries of any kind to the campus.
10. Follow the dress code.

In the rare event that a student repeatedly breaks rules or behaves in a way that endangers themselves or others, parents may be contacted and asked to pick up their student from camp. This is at the discretion of Camp Director Tony Rogatto.

Cell Phones Emergency Contact Numbers

To help students fully engage with God, their peers, and the camp experience, we strongly encourage all students to leave their phones at home for the week and not bring them to check-in. If a student brings a phone to check-in, it will be collected during registration and securely stored until we return to the church—or it may be handed directly to a parent or guardian.
