

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the Texas Armed Services Scholarship Program.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 61.9771(b), Education Code, is amended
5	to read as follows:
6	(b) The amount of a scholarship under this subchapter in an
7	academic year is the lesser of:
8	(1) the greater of \$30,000 or an amount equal to the
9	average cost of attendance at an institution of higher education in
10	this state, as determined by board rule [\$15,000]; or
11	(2) the amount available for each scholarship from
12	appropriations that may be used for scholarships under this
13	subchapter for that academic year.
14	SECTION 2. Section 61.9772, Education Code, is amended by
15	amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to
16	read as follows:
17	(a) To receive an initial scholarship under this
18	subchapter, a student must:
19	(1) be enrolled in a public or private institution of
20	higher education in this state and, while enrolled at the

23	standing of a Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC) program or

24 another [undergraduate] officer commissioning program such as the

- 1 United States Marine Corps Platoon Leaders Class [while enrolled in
- 2 a public or private institution of higher education in this state];
- 3 (B) submit to the board proof of the student's
- 4 successful completion of a program described by Paragraph (A); or
- 5 (C) submit to the board proof of the student's
- 6 acceptance into the officer commissioning program for the Texas
- 7 State Guard, as defined by Section 437.001, Government Code;
- 8 (2) [(3)] be appointed to receive a scholarship by the
- 9 governor, the lieutenant governor, a state senator, or a state
- 10 representative; and
- (3) $[\frac{(4)}{(4)}]$ enter into an agreement with the board under
- 12 Section 61.9773.
- 13 (b) In each year, the governor and the lieutenant governor
- 14 shall [may] each appoint two students and two alternates and each
- 15 state senator and each state representative shall [may] appoint one
- 16 student and one alternate to receive an initial scholarship under
- 17 this subchapter. If a student appointed under this subsection to
- 18 receive a scholarship fails to initially meet eligibility or
- 19 otherwise meet the requirements to initially receive the
- 20 scholarship, the board [Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board]
- 21 must notify the alternate on file of their nomination.
- 22 (b-1) A state senator or state representative shall make the
- 23 appointments required by Subsection (b) not later than September 30
- 24 of each year. If a state senator or state representative fails to
- 25 make a timely appointment in accordance with this subsection, the
- 26 lieutenant governor or the speaker of the house of representatives,
- 27 as appropriate, shall promptly fill the vacancy in appointment or

- 1 designate a member of their respective chamber to promptly make the

- 3 SECTION 3. Section 61.9773, Education Code, is amended to

- 5 Sec. 61.9773. AGREEMENT REQUIREMENTS. (a) To receive a
- 6 scholarship under this subchapter, a student must enter into an
- 7 agreement with the board as provided by this section. The agreement
- 8 must require the student to:
- 9 (1) satisfy one of the following requirements
- 10 [complete]:
- 11 (A) complete or submit to the board proof that
- 12 the student previously completed one year of ROTC training for each
- 13 year that the student receives the scholarship; [or]
- 14 (B) complete or submit to the board proof that
- 15 the student previously completed another [undergraduate] officer
- 16 commissioning program such as the United States Marine Corps
- 17 Platoon Leaders Class; or
- (C) submit to the board proof of the student's
- 19 acceptance into the officer commissioning program for the Texas
- 20 State Guard, as defined by Section 437.001, Government Code;
- 21 (2) graduate not later than six years after the date
- 22 the student first enrolls in a public or private institution of
- 23 higher education in this state;
- 24 (3) after graduation, enter into:
- 25 (A) a four-year commitment to be a member of the
- 26 Texas Army National Guard, Texas Air National Guard, Texas State
- 27 Guard, United States Coast Guard, or United States Merchant Marine;

- 1 or
- 2 (B) a contract to serve as a commissioned officer
- 3 in any branch of the armed services of the United States;
- 4 (4) meet the physical examination requirements and all
- 5 other prescreening requirements of the Texas Army National Guard,
- 6 Texas Air National Guard, Texas State Guard, United States Coast
- 7 Guard, or United States Merchant Marine or the branch of the armed
- 8 services with which the student enters into a contract; and
- 9 (5) agree to repay the scholarship if the student:
- 10 (A) fails to maintain satisfactory academic
- 11 progress;
- 12 (B) withdraws from the scholarship program; or
- 13 (C) fails to fulfill a commitment or contract
- 14 described by Subdivision (3).
- 15 (b) The board shall adopt rules to exempt a student from the
- 16 repayment of a scholarship under an agreement entered into under
- 17 this section if the student is unable to meet the obligations of the
- 18 agreement solely as a result of:
- 19 (1) physical inability; or
- 20 (2) an extraordinary circumstance outside the
- 21 student's control.
- (c) If the board determines that a student who entered into
- 23 an agreement with the board under this section was erroneously
- 24 removed from the scholarship program established under this
- 25 subchapter, the board shall reinstate the student's scholarship if
- 26 the student is currently enrolled in a public or private
- 27 <u>institution of higher education in this state.</u>

- 1 SECTION 4. Section 61.9775, Education Code, is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 61.9775. LIMITATIONS ON SCHOLARSHIP. [(a)] A person
- 4 may not receive a scholarship under this subchapter for more than
- 5 four academic years [after earning a cumulative total of 150 credit
- 6 hours or after being awarded a baccalaureate degree, whichever
- 7 occurs first].
- 8 [(b) A scholarship awarded to a student under this
- 9 subchapter shall be reduced for an academic year by the amount by
- 10 which the full amount of the scholarship plus the total amount to be
- 11 paid to the student for being under contract with one of the
- 12 branches of the armed services of the United States exceeds the
- 13 student's total cost of attendance for that academic year at the

- 20 coordinator for scholarships awarded under this subchapter. The

- 22 (1) serve as a liaison and point of contact for
- 23 students appointed to receive a scholarship under this subchapter;

- 25 (2) coordinate with financial aid offices at public
- 26 and private institutions of higher education in this state and with
- 27 relevant military personnel on behalf of scholarship recipients to

- 1 ensure students fully understand the requirements of this
- 2 <u>subchapter</u>.
- 3 SECTION 6. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
- 4 academic year.
- 5 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

IN RE: HB300 by Wilson (Relating to the Texas Armed Services Scholarship Program.), Conference Committee Report

Estimated Two-year Net Impact to General Revenue Related Funds for HB300, Conference Committee Report: a negative impact of (\$6,070,630) through the biennium ending August 31, 2027.

The bill would make no appropriation but could provide the legal basis for an appropriation of funds to implement the provisions of the bill.

Fiscal Analysis

The bill would increase the award amount for the Texas Armed Service Scholarship Program from \$15,000 to the greater of \$30,000 or the average cost of attendance at all institutions of higher education as determined by the Higher Education Coordinating Board.

Methodology

Based on information provided by the Board, \$3.0 million in additional funding per year would be needed to support the increase of the maximum scholarship for each year of the program. This projection was based on the assumption that the maximum 185 participants will be added to the program each year. The maximum scholarship amount used in the Board's funding projection was based on historical data to calculate the average scholarship that would occur based on the increase to \$30,000, while taking into account the cost of attendance cap.
