3	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
4	→ SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS 164.740 TO 164.7891 IS CREATED
5	TO READ AS FOLLOWS:
6	(1) The General Assembly hereby establishes the Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship
7	Program to ensure that all Kentuckians who have not yet earned a postsecondary
8	degree have affordable access to an industry-recognized certificate, diploma, or
9	associate of applied science degree.
10	(2) For purposes of this section:
11	(a) "Academic term" means a fall, spring, or summer academic term or other
12	time period specified in an administrative regulation promulgated by the
13	authority;
14	(b) "Academic year" means July 1 through June 30 of each year;
15	(c) "Approved dual credit course" means a dual credit course developed in
16	accordance with KRS 164.098 that is a career and technical education
17	course within a career pathway approved by the Kentucky Department of
18	Education that leads to an industry-recognized credential;
19	(d) ''Dual credit tuition rate ceiling'' means the same as defined in 164.786;
20	(e) ''Eligible institution'' means an institution defined in KRS 164.001 that:
21	1. Actively participates in the federal Pell Grant program;
22	2. Executes a contract with the authority on terms the authority deems
23	necessary or appropriate for the administration of its programs;
24	3. Charges no more than the dual credit tuition rate ceiling per credit
25	hour, including any additional fees, for any dual credit course it offers
26	to any Kentucky public or nonpublic high school student; and
27	4. Is a:

1	a. Kentucky Community and Technical Coulege System institution;
2	b. Kentucky public university; or
3	c. College, university, or vocational-technical school that is
4	accredited by a recognized regional or national accrediting body

6	(f) "Eligible program of study" means a program approved by the authority
7	that leads to an industry-recognized certificate, diploma, or associate of
8	applied science degree in one (1) of Kentucky's top five (5) high-demand
9	workforce sectors identified by the Kentucky Workforce Innovation Board
10	and the Education and Workforce Development Cabinet;
11	(g) "Fees" means mandatory fees charged by an eligible institution for
12	enrollment in a course, including but not limited to online course fees, lab
13	fees, and administrative fees. "Fees" does not include tools, books, or other
14	instructional materials that may be required for a course; and
15	(h) "Tuition" means the in-state tuition charged to all students as a condition
16	of enrollment in an eligible institution.
17	(3) In consultation with the Education and Workforce Development Cabinet, the
18	Kentucky Department of Education, and the Council on Postsecondary
19	Education, the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority shall administer
20	the Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship Program and promulgate administrative
21	regulations in accordance with KRS Chapter 13A as may be needed for the
22	administration of the scholarship.
23	(4) An eligible high school student shall:
24	(a) Be a Kentucky resident;
25	(b) Be enrolled in a Kentucky high school;
26	(c) Be enrolled, or accepted for enrollment, in an approved dual credit course
27	at an eligible institution; and

16	<u>(h)</u>	Not be enrolled in an ineligible degree program, such as a bachelor or
17		unapproved associate program, at any postsecondary institution;
18	(i)	Following the first academic term scholarship funds are received, achieve
19		and maintain satisfactory academic progress as determined by the eligible
20		institution; and
21	<u>(j)</u>	Not be in default on any program under Title IV of the federal act or any
22		obligation to the authority under any program administered by the authority
23		under KRS 164.740 to 164.7891 or 164.7894, except that ineligibility for this
24		reason may be waived by the authority for cause.
25	(6) (a)	Beginning with the 2019-2020 academic year, the authority shall award a
26		Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship each academic term to any person who
27		meets the requirements of this section to the extent funds are available for

2	1	(b) The scholarship amount awarded to an eligible workforce student for an
3		academic term shall be the amount remaining after subtracting the
4		student's federal and state grants and scholarships from the maximum
5		scholarship amount. The maximum scholarship amount shall be the per
6		credit hour in-state tuition rate at the Kentucky Community and Technical
7		College System multiplied by the number of credit hours in which the
8		student is enrolled and the fees charged to the student. The authority shall
9		promulgate an administrative regulation in accordance with KRS Chapter
10		13A to specify the maximum amount to be awarded for fees, except that for
11		the 2019-2020 academic year the amount awarded for fees shall not exceed
12		four hundred dollars (\$400).
13	<u>(</u>	(c) The scholarship award for an eligible high school student shall be limited to
14		two (2) approved dual credit courses per academic year. The scholarship
15		amount awarded shall be equal to the amount charged by an eligible
16		institution for an approved dual credit course, in accordance with
17		subsection (2)(e)3. of this section.
18	<u>(7)</u> 2	An eligible workforce student's eligibility for the scholarship shall terminate
19	<u>!</u>	upon the earlier of:
20	<u>(</u>	(a) Receiving the scholarship for four (4) academic terms;
21	<u>(</u>	(b) Receiving the scholarship for a total of sixty (60) credit hours; or
22	<u>(</u>	(c) Obtaining an associate's degree.
23	<u>(8)</u>	The authority shall annually provide a report on the Work Ready Kentucky

6	(9) The authority shall report Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship program data to
7	the Office for Education and Workforce Statistics for analysis of the program's
8	success in meeting the goal of increasing skilled workforce participation rates.
9	(10) (a) The Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship fund is hereby created as a trust
10	fund in the State Treasury to be administered by the authority for the
11	purpose of providing scholarships as described in this section.
12	(b) The trust fund shall consist of state general fund appropriations, gifts and
13	grants from public and private sources, and federal funds. All moneys
14	included in the fund shall be appropriated for the purposes set forth in this
15	section.
16	(c) Any unalloted or unencumbered balances in the trust fund shall be invested
17	as provided in KRS 42.500(9). Income earned from the investments shall be
18	credited to the trust fund.
19	(d) Notwithstanding KRS 45.229, any fund balance at the close of the fiscal
20	year shall not lapse but shall be carried forward to the next fiscal year and
21	continuously appropriated only for the purposes specified in this section.
22	→ Section 2. The General Assembly confirms Executive Order 2018-571, dated
23	July 11, 2018, to the extent not otherwise confirmed or superseded by this Act.
