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1	(b) For a multicounty Case Review Multidisciplinary Team, the director of each local
2	department of social services represented in the multicounty team has the powers and duties
3	enumerated in subsection (a) of this section.
4	"§ 108A-118.5. Case Review Multidisciplinary Team; DHHS responsibility for training

6	The Department of Health and Human Services shall develop and make available for the
7	members of each Case Review Multidisciplinary Team, on an ongoing basis, training materials
8	that address all of the following:

14	(a) Except as prohibited by federal law and notwithstanding any other State law to the
15	contrary, any member of a Case Review Multidisciplinary Team may disclose to other members
16	of the Case Review Multidisciplinary Team any information in the member's possession that is
17	relevant to any of the following:
18	(1) <u>Performing reviews of selected active cases in which disabled adults or older</u>
19	adults are being served by adult protective services through local departments
20	of social services.
21	(2) <u>Providing, arranging, or coordinating services on behalf of disabled adults or</u>
22 23	older adults whose cases have been or are currently under review by the Case
23 24	(b) The local director of social services shall not share any information that discloses the
24 25	identity of individuals who have reported suspected abuse, neglect, or exploitation of a disabled
25 26	adult or older adult to the local department of social services, except as allowed by State or federal
27	law.
28	(c) Meetings of the Case Review Multidisciplinary Team are not subject to the provisions
29	of Article 33C of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes.
30	(d) The authority of a Case Review Multidisciplinary Team to disclose information
31	pursuant to this section terminates when a case is no longer an active case in which a disabled
32	adult or older adult is being served by adult protective services through a local department of
33	social services, including if the inactive status of the case is due to the disabled adult's or older
34	adult's failure to give consent to receive protective services or due to the disabled adult's or older
35	adult's withdrawal of consent to receive protective services.

38	(a) <u>All information and records acquired or generated by a Case Review</u>
39	Multidisciplinary Team during its existence and in the exercise of its duties are confidential and
40 41	may be disclosed only as necessary to carry out the purposes of the Case Review
41 42	Multidisciplinary Team as described in this Article or as otherwise permitted by State or federal law. This subsection does not preclude a court of competent jurisdiction from compelling the
42 43	disclosure of any information or records acquired or generated by a Case Review
44	Multidisciplinary Team if, in the court's opinion, disclosure is necessary to a proper
45	administration of justice and disclosure is not otherwise prohibited by State or federal law.
46	(b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, information generated in a meeting of
47	a Case Review Multidisciplinary Team may be disclosed as provided in this subsection in any of
48	the following circumstances:
49	(1) To a local board of county commissioners when the Case Review
50	Multidisciplinary Team makes its annual recommendations, if any, pursuant
51	to G.S. 108A-118.3(2): provided that such recommendations shall not identify

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1	or reveal any confidential information about individual adult protective
2	services cases reviewed by the Case Review Multidisciplinary Team.
	(2) To a local board of social services by the director of the local department of
	social services when reporting on the activities of the Case Review
	Multidisciplinary Team; provided that such reports shall not identify or reveal
	any confidential information about individual adult protective services cases
	reviewed by the Case Review Multidisciplinary Team.
	(3) By a member of the Case Review Multidisciplinary Team to the member's
	agency or organization as needed to provide or arrange services for a disabled
	adult or older adult.
	(c) Each member of a Case Review Multidisciplinary Team is required to sign a
	statement indicating an understanding of and adherence to the confidentiality requirements of
	this section, including the consequences of any breach of confidentiality. The chair shall submit
	a recommendation, in writing, to the appropriate appointing authority for the removal of any
	member who fails to (i) sign the statement required by this subsection or (ii) comply with the
	confidentiality requirements of this section.
	(d) The local department of social services shall make an entry in the disabled adult's or
	older adult's protective services record at the time it is selected for review by a Case Review
	Multidisciplinary Team to indicate that it was selected for review. Additional entry into the
	record shall be at the discretion of the director of the local department of social services.
	(e) Nothing in this Article shall be construed to prohibit a Case Review Multidisciplinary
	Team from sharing or accessing confidential information and records as permitted or required by
	applicable State or federal law, including any law that permits the disclosure of confidential
	information pursuant to the informed consent of a disabled adult or older adult or the authorized
	representative of a disabled adult or older adult.
	(f) The Social Services Commission may adopt rules consistent with this Article to
	establish protocols for reviews conducted by Case Review Multidisciplinary Teams.
	" <u>§ 108A-118.8.</u> Systemic Review Multidisciplinary Team allowed but not covered by this
	<u>Article.</u>
	Nothing in this Article shall be construed to prohibit a county from establishing both a Case
	Review Multidisciplinary Team and a Systemic Review Multidisciplinary Team. However, this
	Article applies only to a single or multicounty Case Review Multidisciplinary Team established
	pursuant to this Article."
	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 2025.
