- 1 Amend C.S.H.B. No. 4 (house committee report) as follows:
- 2 (1) On page 1, between lines 10 and 11, insert the following
- 3 appropriately numbered SECTIONS to the bill:
- 4 SECTION ____. Section 11.185(b), Education Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (b) Each plan adopted under Subsection (a) must:
- 7 (1) identify annual goals for students in each group
- 8 evaluated under the closing the gaps domain under Section
- 9 39.053(c)(3);
- 10 (2) include annual goals for aggregate student growth
- 11 on the third grade reading <u>language arts</u> or mathematics assessment
- 12 instrument, as applicable, administered under Section 39.023 or on
- 13 an alternative assessment instrument determined by the board of
- 14 trustees;
- 15 (3) provide for targeted professional development for
- 16 classroom teachers in kindergarten or first, second, or third grade
- 17 who are assigned to campuses that the board of trustees identifies
- 18 as not meeting the plan's goals;
- 19 (4) assign at least one district-level administrator
- 20 or employee of the regional education service center for the
- 21 district's region to:
- 22 (A) coordinate implementation of the plan; and
- 23 (B) submit an annual report to the board of
- 24 trustees on the district's progress toward the goals set under the
- 25 plan; and
- 26 (5) be reviewed annually by the board of trustees at a
- 27 public meeting.
- 28 SECTION _____. Section 21.4552(c), Education Code, is
- 29 amended to read as follows:

- 1 (c) The commissioner shall adopt criteria for selecting
- 2 teachers who may attend a literacy achievement academy. In
- 3 adopting selection criteria under this subsection, the
- 4 commissioner shall:
- 5 (1) require a teacher to attend a literacy achievement
- 6 academy if the teacher provides instruction in reading,
- 7 mathematics, science, or social studies to students at the sixth,
- 8 seventh, or eighth grade level at a campus that fails to satisfy any
- 9 standard under Section 39.054(e) on the basis of student
- 10 performance on the reading <u>language arts</u> assessment instrument
- 11 administered under Section 39.023(a) to students in any grade level
- 12 at the campus;
- 13 (2) grant priority to teachers employed by a school
- 14 district at a campus at which 50 percent or more of the students
- 15 enrolled are educationally disadvantaged; and
- 16 (3) provide a process through which a teacher not
- 17 employed at a campus described by Subdivision (2) may attend the
- 18 academy if the academy has available space and the school district
- 19 employing the teacher pays the costs of the teacher's attendance.
- 20 (2) On page 1, line 19, between "reading" and the open
- 21 bracket, insert "language arts".
- 22 (3) On page 1, between lines 20 and 21, insert the following
- 23 appropriately numbered SECTIONS to the bill:
- 24 SECTION ____. Section 29.056(g), Education Code, is amended
- 25 to read as follows:
- 26 (g) A district may transfer an emergent bilingual student
- 27 out of a bilingual education or special language program for the
- 28 first time or a subsequent time if the student is able to
- 29 participate equally in a regular all-English instructional program
- 30 as determined by:
- 31 (1) agency-approved tests administered at the end of

- 1 each school year to determine the extent to which the student has
- 2 developed oral and written language proficiency and specific
- 3 language skills in English;
- 4 (2) satisfactory performance on the reading language
- 5 arts assessment instrument under Section 39.023(a) or [an English
- 6 language arts assessment instrument under Section] 39.023(c), as
- 7 applicable, with the assessment instrument administered in
- 8 English, or, if the student is enrolled in the first or second
- 9 grade, an achievement score at or above the 40th percentile in the
- 10 reading and language arts sections of an English standardized test
- 11 approved by the agency; and
- 12 (3) agency-approved criterion-referenced tests and
- 13 the results of a subjective teacher evaluation.
- 14 SECTION ____. Section 29.1543, Education Code, is amended
- 15 to read as follows:
- Sec. 29.1543. EARLY EDUCATION REPORTS. The agency shall
- 17 produce and make available to the public on the agency's Internet
- 18 website annual district and campus-level reports containing
- 19 information from the previous school year on early education in
- 20 school districts and open-enrollment charter schools. A report
- 21 under this section must contain:
- 22 (1) the information required by Section 29.1532(c) to
- 23 be reported through the Public Education Information Management
- 24 System (PEIMS);
- 25 (2) a description of the diagnostic reading
- 26 instruments administered in accordance with Section 28.006(c) or
- 27 (c-2);
- 28 (3) the number of students who were administered a
- 29 diagnostic reading instrument administered in accordance with
- 30 Section 28.006(c) or (c-2);
- 31 (4) the number of students whose scores from a

- 1 diagnostic reading instrument administered in accordance with
- 2 Section 28.006(c) or (c-2) indicate reading proficiency;
- 3 (5) the number of kindergarten students who were
- 4 enrolled in a prekindergarten program in the previous school year
- 5 in the same district or school as the district or school in which
- 6 the student attends kindergarten;
- 7 (6) the number and percentage of students who perform
- 8 satisfactorily on the third grade reading <u>language arts</u> or
- 9 mathematics assessment instrument administered under Section
- 10 39.023, disaggregated by whether the student was eligible for free
- 11 prekindergarten under Section 29.153;
- 12 (7) the number of students described by Subdivision
- 13 (6) who attended kindergarten in the district, disaggregated by:
- 14 (A) whether the student met the kindergarten
- 15 readiness standard on the reading instrument adopted under Section
- 16 28.006;
- 17 (B) whether the student attended prekindergarten
- 18 in the district; and
- 19 (C) the type of prekindergarten the student
- 20 attended, if applicable; and
- 21 (8) the information described by Subdivisions (6) and
- 22 (7) disaggregated by whether the student is educationally
- 23 disadvantaged.
- 24 (4) On page 3, line 7, between "reading" and the underlined
- 25 comma, insert "language arts".
- 26 (5) On page 4, strike lines 1 through 3 and substitute
- 27 "amending Subsections (a), (a-1), (a-2), (a-3), (a-11), (a-12),
- 28 (a-13), (b), (b-1), (c), (c-1), (c-8), (g), (h), and (n) and adding
- 29 Subsections (a-5), (a-10), (o-1), (q), and (r) to read as
- 30 follows:".
- 31 (6) On page 4, line 10, between "reading" and the comma,

- 1 insert "language arts".
- 2 (7) On page 4, line 16, between "reading" and the comma,
- 3 insert "language arts".
- 4 (8) On page 5, line 14, between "reading" and "assessment",
- 5 insert "language arts".
- 6 (9) On page 6, strike lines 3 through 5 and substitute
- 7 "state curriculum standards and a student's annual through-year
- 8 instructional growth;".
- 9 (10) On page 6, strike lines 6 and 7 and reletter subsequent
- 10 paragraphs of the subdivision accordingly.
- 11 (11) On page 6, between lines 26 and 27, insert the
- 12 following:
- 13 (a-3) The agency may not adopt or develop a <u>nationally</u>
- 14 norm-referenced or criterion-referenced assessment instrument
- 15 under this section based on common core state standards as defined
- 16 by Section 28.002(b-1). This subsection does not prohibit the use
- 17 of college advanced placement tests or international baccalaureate
- 18 examinations as those terms are defined by Section 28.051.
- 19 (12) On page 8, line 13, between "reading" and the
- 20 underlined comma, insert "language arts".
- 21 (13) On page 8, between lines 16 and 17, insert the
- 22 following:
- 23 (b) The agency shall [develop or] adopt appropriate
- 24 nationally norm-referenced [criterion-referenced] alternative
- 25 assessment instruments to be administered to each student in a
- 26 special education program under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, for whom
- 27 an assessment instrument adopted under Subsection (a), even with
- 28 allowable accommodations, would not provide an appropriate measure
- 29 of student achievement, as determined by the student's admission,
- 30 review, and dismissal committee[, including assessment instruments
- 31 approved by the commissioner that measure growth]. The assessment

- 1 instruments [developed or] adopted under this subsection[7
- 2 including the assessment instruments approved by the
- 3 commissioner, must, to the extent allowed under federal law,
- 4 provide a district with options for the assessment of students
- 5 under this subsection. The agency may not adopt a performance
- 6 standard that indicates that a student's performance on the
- 7 alternate assessment does not meet standards if the lowest level of
- 8 the assessment accurately represents the student's developmental
- 9 level as determined by the student's admission, review, and
- 10 dismissal committee.
- 11 (b-1) The agency, in conjunction with appropriate
- 12 interested persons, shall redevelop assessment instruments adopted
- 13 [or developed] under Subsection (b) for administration to
- 14 significantly cognitively disabled students in a manner consistent
- 15 with federal law. An assessment instrument under this subsection
- 16 may not require a teacher to prepare tasks or materials for a
- 17 student who will be administered such an assessment instrument. A
- 18 classroom portfolio method used to assess writing performance may
- 19 require a teacher to prepare tasks and materials.
- 20 (14) On page 8, line 18, between "reading" and the comma,
- 21 insert "language arts".
- 22 (15) Strike page 9, line 24, through page 10, line 21.
- 23 (16) On page 10, between lines 21 and 22, insert the
- 24 following:
- 25 (g) The State Board of Education may adopt one appropriate,
- 26 nationally recognized, norm-referenced assessment instrument in
- 27 reading <u>language arts</u> and mathematics to be administered to a
- 28 selected sample of students in the spring. If adopted, a
- 29 norm-referenced assessment instrument must be a secured test. The
- 30 state may pay the costs of purchasing and scoring the adopted
- 31 assessment instrument and of distributing the results of the

- 1 adopted instrument to the school districts. A district that
- 2 administers the norm-referenced test adopted under this subsection
- 3 shall report the results to the agency in a manner prescribed by the
- 4 commissioner.
- 5 (17) On page 11, between lines 5 and 6, insert the
- 6 following:
- 7 (n) This subsection applies only to a student who is
- 8 determined to have dyslexia or a related disorder and who is an
- 9 individual with a disability under 29 U.S.C. Section 705(20) and
- 10 its subsequent amendments. The agency shall adopt [or develop]
- 11 appropriate <u>norm-referenced</u> [criterion-referenced] assessment
- 12 instruments designed to assess the ability of and to be
- 13 administered to each student to whom this subsection applies for
- 14 whom the assessment instruments adopted under Subsection (a), even
- 15 with allowable modifications, would not provide an appropriate
- 16 measure of student achievement, as determined by the committee
- 17 established by the board of trustees of the district to determine
- 18 the placement of students with dyslexia or related disorders. The
- 19 committee shall determine whether any allowable modification is
- 20 necessary in administering to a student an assessment instrument
- 21 required under this subsection. The assessment instruments
- 22 required under this subsection shall be administered on the same
- 23 schedule as the assessment instruments administered under
- 24 Subsection (a).
- 25 (18) On page 12, line 4, immediately following
- 26 "prekindergarten,", insert "kindergarten,".
- 27 (19) On page 12, line 17, between "reading" and the open
- 28 bracket, insert "language arts".
- 29 (20) On page 13, line 1, between "reading" and the open
- 30 bracket, insert "language arts".
- 31 (21) On page 13, line 7, immediately following "reading",

- 1 add "language arts".
- 2 (22) On page 13, between lines 8 and 9, insert the following
- 3 appropriately numbered SECTION to the bill:
- 4 SECTION ____. Section 39.027(e), Education Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (e) The commissioner shall adopt a norm-referenced [develop
- 7 an] assessment system that shall be used for evaluating the
- 8 academic progress, including reading proficiency in English, of all
- 9 emergent bilingual students, as defined by Section 29.052. A
- 10 student who is exempt from the administration of an assessment
- 11 instrument under Subsection (a)(1) or (2) who achieves reading
- 12 proficiency in English as determined by the assessment system
- 13 <u>adopted</u> [developed] under this subsection shall be administered the
- 14 assessment instruments described by Sections 39.023(a) and (c).
- 15 The performance under the assessment system <u>adopted</u> [developed]
- 16 under this subsection of students to whom Subsection (a)(1) or (2)
- 17 applies shall be included in the indicator systems under Section
- 18 39.301, as applicable, the performance report under Section 39.306,
- 19 and the comprehensive biennial report under Section 39.332. This
- 20 information shall be provided in a manner that is disaggregated by
- 21 the bilingual education or special language program, if any, in
- 22 which the student is enrolled.
- 23 (23) On page 14, line 10, between "may" and "modify", insert
- 24 "not".
- 25 (24) On page 14, line 12, strike "only with the express
- 26 approval of the legislature" and substitute "unless the legislature
- 27 provides written approval for the modification".
- 28 (25) On page 15, line 23, between "reading" and "or", insert
- 29 "language arts".
- 30 (26) On page 17, line 19, between "reading" and the
- 31 underlined comma, insert "language arts".

- 1 (27) On page 18, line 17, between "activities" and the
- 2 underlined semicolon, insert "consistent with the findings of the
- 3 extracurricular and cocurricular student activity indicator study
- 4 required under Section 39.0533, as that section existed immediately
- 5 before September 1, 2023".
- 6 (28) On page 21, strike lines 6 through 9 and substitute the
- 7 following:
- 8 eight:
- 9 (A) attribute not less than 50 percent of the
- 10 domain performance rating for the student achievement domain under
- 11 Section 39.053(c)(1) to the indicators adopted under Section
- 12 39.053(c)(1)(A);
- 13 (B) attribute 100 percent of the score for the
- 14 indicators adopted under Section 39.053(c)(1)(A) to student
- 15 performance on end-of-year assessment instruments and may not
- 16 consider the results of beginning-of-year and middle-of-year
- 17 assessment instruments when scoring those indicators; and
- 18 (C) attribute 100 percent of the score for the
- 19 indicator adopted under Section 39.053(c)(2)(A) to student
- 20 performance on annual through-year instructional growth in
- 21 assigning the domain performance rating for the school progress
- 22 domain under Section 39.053(c)(2);
- 23 (29) On page 21, line 27, strike "reviews, adjusts, and
- 24 recalculates" and substitute "shall review, adjust, and
- 25 recalculate".
- 26 (30) On page 22, strike line 4 and substitute the following:
- 27 (2) the overall performance rating and each domain
- 28 performance rating an elementary school, middle or junior high
- 29 school, or high school campus receives has minimal
- 30 (31) On page 23, line 20, immediately following
- 31 "standards", add ". If the commissioner does not adopt performance

- 1 standards by the date required under this subsection for a school
- 2 year, district and campus performance ratings for that school year
- 3 shall be based on the performance standards in effect for the
- 4 preceding school year".
- 5 (32) On page 25, immediately following line 27, insert the
- 6 following:
- 7 (d) A court may grant any appropriate relief to a prevailing
- 8 party in an action brought by a school district or open-enrollment
- 9 charter school described by Subsection (a).
- 10 (33) On page 26, line 7, strike "[English language arts]"
- 11 and substitute "[English] language arts".
- 12 (34) On page 26, between lines 8 and 9, insert the following
- 13 appropriately numbered SECTION:
- 14 SECTION _____. Section 39A.064(a), Education Code, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 (a) Notwithstanding [Section 39A.0545(b) or] any other law,
- 17 the commissioner may require a school district or open-enrollment
- 18 charter school to comply with all requirements of the strong
- 19 foundations grant program under Section 29.0881 at a campus that:
- 20 (1) includes students at any grade level from
- 21 prekindergarten through fifth grade;
- 22 (2) is assigned an overall performance rating of D or
- 23 F; and
- 24 (3) is in the bottom five percent of campuses in the
- 25 state based on student performance on the grade three reading
- 26 language arts assessment administered under Section 39.023(a)
- 27 during the previous school year, as determined by the commissioner.
- 28 (35) Renumber SECTIONS of the bill accordingly.
