A bill to amend 2018 PA 337, entitled "Improved workforce opportunity wage act,"

by amending section 4 (MCL 408.934), as amended by 2018 PA 368; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

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(a) Beginning January 1, 2021, \$9.65. 1 (b) Beginning January 1, 2022, \$11.00. 2 (c) Beginning January 1, 2023, \$12.00. 3 (d) Beginning January 1, 2024, \$13.00. 4 (e) Beginning January 1, 2025, \$14.00. 5 6 (f) Beginning January 1, 2026, \$15.00. 7 (2) An increase in the minimum hourly wage rate as prescribed 8 in subsection (1) does not take effect if the unemployment rate for 9 this state, as determined by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, United 10 States Department of Labor, is 8.5% or greater for the calendar 11 year preceding the calendar year of the prescribed increase. An 12 increase in the minimum hourly wage rate as prescribed in 13 subsection (1) that does not take effect pursuant to this 14 subsection takes effect in the first calendar year following a 15 calendar year for which the unemployment rate for this state, as 16 determined by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, United States 17 Department of Labor, is less than 8.5%. (2) Every January beginning in January 2027, the state 18

19 treasurer shall adjust the minimum hourly wage rate then in effect 20 by an amount determined by the state treasurer at the end of the 21 immediately preceding calendar year to reflect the average annual 22 percentage change in the consumer price index for the most recent 23 5-year period for which data are available. The wage and hour 24 division of the department of labor and economic opportunity shall 25 post the adjusted minimum wage on its website by February 1 of the year it is calculated, and the adjusted rate is effective beginning 26 April 1 of that year. As used in this subsection, "consumer price 27 28 index" means the most comprehensive index of consumer prices 29 available for the Midwest region from the United States Department

2 Enacting section 1. Section 4d of the improved workforce
3 opportunity wage act, 2018 PA 337, MCL 408.934d, is repealed.
