8	SI	ECTION 1.(a) Article 8C of Chapter 115C of the General Sta	tutes is amended by

11	<u>(a)</u> <u>A</u>	school resource officer is any law enforcement officer assig	ned to one or more	
12	public schools within a public school unit for at least 20 hours per week for more than 12 weeks			
13	per calendar year to assist with all of the following, consistent with any written memorandum of			
14	understanding between the public school unit and the law enforcement agency governing the			
15	school resour	ce officer:		
16	<u>(1</u>	) <u>School safety.</u>		
17	<u>(2</u>	) <u>School security.</u>		
18	<u>(3</u>	) <u>Emergency preparedness.</u>		
19	<u>(4</u>	) Emergency response.		
20	<u>(5</u>	) Any additional responsibilities related to school safety or	security assigned by	
21		the officer's employer while the officer is acting as a scho		
22	<u>(b)</u> <u>A</u>	ll school resource officers shall comply with initial training stand	dards, as established	
23	by subsection (c) of this section, within one year of being assigned as a school resource officer.			
24	After initial training, all school resource officers shall comply with continuing education			
25	standards, as established by subsection (c) of this section.			
26	<u>(c)</u> <u>T</u>	ne North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training Sta	ndards Commission	
27	and the North Carolina Sheriffs' Education and Training Standards Commission, in collaboration			
28	with the Center for Safer Schools, shall establish initial training and continuing education			
29	standards for school resource officers. These standards shall, at a minimum, include training on			
30	the following topics: mental health, students with disabilities, racial equity, and crisis			
31	intervention and de-escalation."

3	SECTION 1.(d) The North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training		
4	Standards Commission and the North Carolina Sheriffs' Education and Training Standards		
5	Commission shall establish initial training standards for school resource officers no later than		
6	January 15, 2026.		
7	<b>SECTION 1.(e)</b> Subsection (a) of this section applies to school resource officers		
8	assigned on or after January 1, 2026. All school resource officers assigned before January 1,		
9	2026, shall complete initial training no later than December 31, 2026.		
10	SECTION 2.(a) Article 18 of Chapter 7B of the General Statutes is amended by		
11	adding a new section to read:		
12	" <u>§ 7B-1802A. School-based complaints.</u>		
13	A school-based complaint in which delinquency is alleged to have occurred initiated by a		
14	school resource officer, as defined in G.S. 115C-105.70, shall be signed by a school administrator		
15	or school social worker prior to being referred in accordance with G.S. 7B-1803 or filed in a		
16	court of competent jurisdiction. For the purposes of this section, "a school-based complaint"		
17	means a complaint in which delinquency is alleged to have occurred on school grounds, school		
18	property, at a school bus stop, or at an off-campus school-sanctioned event, or whose victim is		
19	identified as a school."		
20	<b>SECTION 2.(b)</b> This section becomes effective on January 1, 2026, and applies to		
21	school-based complaints initiated on or after that date by school resource officers.		
22	<b>SECTION 3.</b> Except where otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes		
23	law.
