STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

*In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Eighteen*

AN ACT           relative to course requirements in a career and technical education program.

*Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:*

1           108:1 State Board of Education; Rulemaking; Competency in Mathematics. Amend  
2 RSA 186:8, VIII to read as follows:

3           VIII. Requiring a high school pupil to attain competency in mathematics for each  
4 year in which he or she is in high school through graduation to ensure career and  
5 college readiness. A pupil may meet this requirement either by satisfactorily completing  
6 a minimum of 4 courses in mathematics or by satisfactorily completing a minimum of 3  
7 mathematics courses and one non-mathematics content area course, ***including, but not***  
8 ***limited to, a CTE program under RSA 188-E***, in which mathematics knowledge and skills  
9 are embedded and applied, as may be approved by the school board. The rules shall be  
10 implemented in the 2015-16 school year.

108:2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
