SECTION 2. G.S. 126-5 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

"(c19) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, G.S. 126-14.5 shall apply to all exempt and nonexempt State employees in the executive, legislative, and judicial branches."

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
