8		b. A postsecondary constituent institution of The University of North
9		Carolina, as defined in G.S. 116-2(4).
10		c. An eligible private postsecondary institution, as defined in
11		G.S. 116-280(3).
12	(3)	Eligible student Either of the following types of students enrolled in an

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1	(5)	Death and disability. – The Authority may forgive all or part of a loan if it
2 3		determines that it is impossible for the recipient to repay the loan in cash or
3		service because of the death or disability of the recipient.
4	(6)	Hardship The Authority may grant a forbearance, a deferment, or both in
5		hardship circumstances when a good-faith effort has been made to repay the
6		loan in a timely manner.
7	(7)	Other The Authority may establish other terms and conditions that are
8		necessary or convenient to effectuate the Pilot Program.
9	SEC	TION 2.4.(e) Rulemaking Authority. – The Authority may adopt rules
10	necessary to impl	ement, administer, market, and enforce the provisions of this section.
11	SEC	TION 2.4.(f) Report to the General Assembly. – The Authority shall report no
12	later than Decem	ber 1, 2024, and annually thereafter while loans are held or forgiven by the
13	Authority, to the	Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee and the Joint Legislative
14	Oversight Comm	ittee on Health and Human Services regarding the Pilot Program and loans
15	awarded pursuant	to the Pilot Program, including at least the following information:
16	(1)	Forgivable loans awarded by the Authority, including the following:
17		a. Demographic information regarding loan recipients.
18		b. Number of loan recipients by degree and eligible postsecondary
19		institution.
20	(2)	Placement and repayment rates, including the following:
21		a. Number of loan recipients who have been employed on a full-time
22		basis in a rural area within two years of graduation.
23		b. Number of loan recipients who have elected cash repayment in lieu of
24		service repayment and their years of service, if any, prior to beginning
25		cash repayment.
26	(3)	Recommendations to expand the Pilot Program and increase the number of
27		licensed physicians and nurses practicing in rural areas.
28		TON 2.4.(g) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of
29		University of North Carolina for the 2023-2024 fiscal year the sum of fourteen
30		red thousand dollars (\$14,400,000) in nonrecurring funds to be allocated to the
31		Assistance Authority to provide forgivable loans to an estimated 200 eligible
32		dance with the Doctors and Nurses in Rural Areas Forgivable Loan Pilot
33		ed pursuant to subsection (a) of this section. Except as provided in subdivision
34	. ,	(d) of this section, these funds shall not revert to the General Fund at the end of
