- 1 Amend H.B. No. 2598 (house committee report) by adding the
- 2 following appropriately numbered SECTIONS to the bill and
- 3 renumbering subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:
- 4 SECTION ____. Section 61.601, Education Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 61.601. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "mental
- 7 health professional" means:
- 8 (1) a licensed physician who is:
- 9 (A) a graduate of an accredited psychiatric
- 10 residency training program; or
- 11 (B) certified in psychiatry by:
- 12 (i) the American Board of Psychiatry and
- 13 Neurology; or
- 14 (ii) the American Osteopathic Board of
- 15 Neurology and Psychiatry;
- 16 (2) a psychologist, as defined by Section 501.002,
- 17 Occupations Code;
- 18 (3) a licensed professional counselor, as defined by
- 19 Section 503.002, Occupations Code;
- 20 (4) an advanced practice registered nurse, as defined
- 21 by Section 301.152, Occupations Code, who holds a nationally
- 22 recognized board certification in psychiatric or mental health
- 23 nursing;
- 24 (5) a licensed clinical social worker, as defined by
- 25 Section 505.002, Occupations Code;
- 26 (6) a [licensed specialist in] school <u>psychologist</u>
- 27 [psychology], as defined by Section 501.002, Occupations Code;
- (7) a chemical dependency counselor, as defined by
- 29 Section 504.001, Occupations Code; and

- 1 (8) a licensed marriage and family therapist, as
- 2 defined by Section 502.002, Occupations Code.
- 3 SECTION ____. Section 61.607(b), Education Code, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 (b) The total amount of repayment assistance received by a
- 6 mental health professional under this subchapter may not exceed:
- 7 (1) \$160,000, for assistance from the state received
- 8 by a licensed physician;
- 9 (2) \$80,000, for assistance from the state received
- 10 by:
- 11 (A) a psychologist;
- 12 (B) a licensed clinical social worker, if the
- 13 social worker has received a doctoral degree related to social
- 14 work;
- 15 (C) a licensed professional counselor, if the
- 16 counselor has received a doctoral degree related to counseling; or
- 17 (D) a licensed marriage and family therapist, if
- 18 the marriage and family therapist has received a doctoral degree
- 19 related to marriage and family therapy;
- 20 (3) \$60,000, for assistance from the state received by
- 21 an advanced practice registered nurse;
- 22 (4) \$40,000, for assistance from the state received
- 23 by:
- 24 (A) a licensed clinical social worker, a licensed
- 25 marriage and family therapist, or a licensed professional counselor
- 26 who is not described by Subdivision (2); or
- 27 (B) a [licensed specialist in] school
- 28 psychologist [psychology]; and
- (5) \$10,000, for assistance from the state received by
- 30 a licensed chemical dependency counselor, if the chemical
- 31 dependency counselor has received an associate degree related to

- 1 chemical dependency counseling or behavioral science.
- 2 SECTION _____. Section 411.12502(a), Government Code, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 (a) The Texas Behavioral Health Executive Council is
- 5 entitled to obtain criminal history record information as provided
- 6 by Subsection (b) that relates to a person who is an applicant for
- 7 or licensed as:
- 8 (1) a licensed psychologist, licensed psychological
- 9 associate, or [licensed specialist in] school psychologist
- 10 [psychology] under Chapter 501, Occupations Code;
- 11 (2) a licensed marriage and family therapist or
- 12 licensed marriage and family therapist associate under Chapter 502,
- 13 Occupations Code;
- 14 (3) a licensed professional counselor or licensed
- 15 professional counselor associate under Chapter 503, Occupations
- 16 Code; or
- 17 (4) a licensed baccalaureate social worker, licensed
- 18 master social worker, or licensed clinical social worker under
- 19 Chapter 505, Occupations Code.
