9	treatment programs (OTPs) in 10A NCAC 27G .3600 through 10A NCAC 27G .3605, to be more			
10	consistent with 42 C.F.R. Part 8 governing medications for the treatment of opioid use disorder			
11	In amending these rules, the Commission shall make at least all of the following changes:			
12	(1)	Remove stability of a patient's home environment and social re	lationships as	
13		an eligibility criterion for take-home medication.		
14	(2)	Explicitly prohibit administrative discharge from treatment due		
15		substance use, missed doses, and nonparticipation in ancillary	services such	
16		as counseling.		
17	(3)	Remove structured counseling schedules to better align
