- 3 SECTION 1. Section 614.015, Government Code, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 614.015. MENTAL HEALTH LEAVE FOR PUBLIC SAFETY
- 6 EMPLOYEES [PEACE OFFICERS AND TELECOMMUNICATORS]. (a) In this
- 7 section, "public safety employee" means a peace officer, fire
- 8 fighter, detention officer, county jailer, or emergency medical
- 9 services employee of this state or a political subdivision of this
- 10 state. The term includes a person [+
- 11 [(1) "Law enforcement agency" means an agency of the
- 12 state or of a political subdivision of the state authorized by law
- 13 to employ peace officers.
- 14 [(2) "Telecommunicator" means a person] authorized to
- 15 act as a telecommunicator under Section 1701.405, Occupations Code\_
- 16 or a person acting in a similar capacity under Chapter 773, Health
- 17 and Safety Code.
- 18 (b) Each entity [law enforcement agency, and each agency] of
- 19 the state or of a political subdivision of the state that employs a
- 20 public safety employee [full-time telecommunicator,] shall develop
- 21 and adopt a policy allowing the use of mental health leave by the
- 22 public safety employees [peace officers and full-time
- 23 telecommunicators, as applicable, employed by the entity [agency]
- 24 who experience a traumatic event in the scope of that employment.
- 25 (c) A mental health leave policy adopted under this section
- 26 must:
- 27 (1) provide clear and objective guidelines
- 28 establishing the circumstances under which a <u>public safety employee</u>
- 29 [peace officer or telecommunicator] is granted and may use mental

- 1 health leave;
- 2 (2) entitle a public safety employee [peace officer or
- 3 telecommunicator] to mental health leave without a deduction in
- 4 salary or other compensation;
- 5 (3) enumerate the number of mental health leave days
- 6 available to a public safety employee [peace officer or
- 7 telecommunicator]; and
- 8 (4) detail the level of anonymity for a public safety
- 9 employee [peace officer or telecommunicator] who takes mental
- 10 health leave.
- 11 (d) A mental health leave policy adopted under this section
- 12 may provide a list of mental health services available to public
- 13 safety employees [peace officers and telecommunicators] in the area
- 14 of the [law enforcement or] employing entity [agency].
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
