3 **SECTION 3.(b)** This section becomes effective December 1, 2024, and applies to 4 offenses committed on or after that date.

5 **SECTION 4.(a)** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Administrative 6 Office of the Courts the sum of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) in nonrecurring funds 7 for the 2024-2025 fiscal year to be used to further the work of the North Carolina Human

8 Trafficking Commission.

9 **SECTION 4.(b)** This section becomes effective July 1, 2024.

10 **SECTION 5.** Except as otherwise provided, this act becomes effective October 1, 11 2024, and applies to activities occurring on or after that date.
