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L 6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L7	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
18	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
L 9	A. Effective July 1, 2019, all full-time and part-time officers
20	and employees, including temporary and other limited-term employees,
21	of the state who were employed by the state on the last working day
22	of June 2019 shall be awarded an annualized salary increase equal to
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- B. As used in this section, "temporary and other limited-term employees" are those persons who:
 - 1. Are not full-time or permanent employees;

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- 2. Are not otherwise excluded by this section; and
- 3. Are compensated by an agency, board, commission or department or other employing entity for a limited duration without any subjective expectation by either the employer or the employee that the employment will become permanent.
- C. Except for those personnel specifically excluded from eligibility for any increase or advancement in salary pursuant to this section, the salary increase provided by this section shall be applicable to:
 - 1. Employees of county health departments;
 - 2. Employees of a conservation district; and
 - 3. Employees of the George Nigh Rehabilitation Institute.
- D. Employees eligible for the increase provided for in subsection A of this section who are on leave without pay on July 1, 2019, shall receive an annualized increase, effective upon their return to work, but shall not receive any increase for a period of time prior to their return to work.
- E. Employees who leave the state's service before July 1, 2019, who are reinstated or reemployed in the state's service during July 2019 without a break in service and who are otherwise eligible for the pay increase provided for in this section shall be granted such

- 1 | raise effective immediately upon such reinstatement or reemployment.
- 2 As used in this subsection, "break in service" is defined as a
- 3 period of time in excess of thirty (30) calendar days between two
- 4 (2) periods of state employment.
- 5 F. The following officers and employees shall be ineligible for
- 6 a pay increase pursuant to this section and nothing, except as
- 7 otherwise provided by Section 840-2.17 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma
- 8 | Statutes, shall be construed to authorize any increase or
- 9 advancement of the salaries of:
- 10 | 1. Any elected official;
- 2. Any cabinet secretary whose salary is governed by Section
- 12 | 10.5 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 3. Any agency director;
- 4. Any justice or judge whose salary is governed by the
- 15 provisions of Title 85A of the Oklahoma Statutes or whose
- 16 | compensation is set by the Board on Judicial Compensation pursuant
- 17 to Section 3.4 of Title 20 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 18 5. Any district attorney whose salary is governed by Section

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7. Persons employed pursuant to Section 2241 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

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- 8. Persons employed pursuant to Section 1.6a of Title 53 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 9. Persons who are employed or under contract pursuant to subsection B of Section 1419 of Title 10 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and
- 10. The Adjutant General and Assistant Adjutants General pursuant to Section 27 of Title 44 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- G. No salary increase pursuant to this section shall be made that exceeds a salary limitation provided in an agency's annual appropriation bill or salary limits set by statute. Classified employees eligible for the salary increase provided for in this section shall receive such increase even though it causes the employee's salary to exceed the maximum for the employee's pay band.
- H. With respect to any employee who is not a full-time employee, the salary increase amount otherwise authorized by subsection A of this section shall be prorated using a methodology applicable to the employee's compensation, weeks worked, months worked, hours worked or similar method.
- SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 20 O.S. 2011, Section 106.9, is amended to read as follows:
- Section 106.9 A. Until October 1, 2006, the salaries of all court reporters regularly engaged by the district court, the

1 Workers' Compensation Court, or the Corporation Commission shall be 2 paid by the state, except as otherwise provided in this section. 3 Full-time court reporters regularly engaged by the district court, 4 the Workers' Compensation Court and the Corporation Commission who 5 are certified shorthand reporters shall be paid Thirty-five Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$35,600.00) per year, payable monthly. 6 7 Effective October 1, 2006, the salaries of all court reporters regularly engaged by the district court, the Workers' Compensation 8 Court, or the Corporation Commission shall be paid by the state, 10 except as otherwise provided in this section. Full-time court 11 reporters regularly engaged by the district court, the Workers' 12 Compensation Court and the Corporation Commission who are certified 13 shorthand reporters shall be paid as follows:

1. Beginning October 1, 2006, through June 30, 2019, Thirtynine Thousand One Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$39,160.00) per year,
payable monthly, and

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- 2. Beginning July 1, 2019, per year, payable monthly.
 - B. In addition to their base salaries, official court reporters who are certified or licensed shorthand reporters and those acting shorthand reporters pursuant to paragraph c of Section 106.3B of this title shall be paid annually the sum of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) for each year of service to the district court, the Workers' Compensation Court and the Corporation Commission, with a

maximum of twenty (20) years of service only to be used for the purpose of longevity, not to exceed Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000.00) per year, payable monthly. For the purpose of payment for longevity, "years of service" is defined as all years served as a certified or licensed court reporter in the district court, the Workers' Compensation Court and the Corporation Commission after June 30, 1978. Such longevity payments shall begin on July 1 of each year following completion of one (1) year's service as defined herein.

- C. In addition to their base salaries, official court reporters who are certified shorthand reporters shall be paid the following:
- 1. The sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) per year, payable monthly, to any official court reporter who is a Registered Professional Reporter (RPR), as recognized by the State Board of Examiners of Certified Shorthand Reporters. To qualify as a RPR, an official court reporter shall have a proficiency level in reporting testimony and proceedings of a speed of not less than two hundred twenty-five (225) words per minute in taking a question-and-answer-type dictation, two hundred (200) words per minute in taking a jury charge and one hundred eighty (180) words per minute in taking literary material, shall pass a Written Knowledge Test with a score of at least seventy percent (70%), all as determined by an examination recognized by the Board, and shall complete thirty (30)

hours of continuing education per three-year cycle commencing at the date of recognition;

- 2. The sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) per year, payable monthly, to any official court reporter who is a Registered Merit Reporter (RMR), as recognized by the State Board of Examiners of Certified Shorthand Reporters. To qualify as a RMR, an official court reporter shall have a proficiency level in reporting testimony and proceedings of a speed of not less than two hundred sixty (260) words per minute in taking a question-and-answer-type dictation, two hundred forty (240) words per minute in taking a jury charge and two hundred (200) words per minute in taking literary material, shall pass a Written Knowledge Test with a score of at least seventy percent (70%), all as determined by an examination recognized by the Board, and shall complete thirty (30) hours of continuing education per three-year cycle commencing at the date of recognition;
- 3. The sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) per year, payable monthly, to any official court reporter who is a Registered Diplomat Reporter (RDR), as recognized by the State Board of Examiners of Certified Shorthand Reporters, and who completes thirty (30) hours of continuing education per three-year cycle commencing at the date of recognition;
- 4. The sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) per year, payable monthly, to any official court reporter who is a

Certified Realtime Reporter (CRR), as recognized by the State Board of Examiners of Certified Shorthand Reporters, and who completes thirty (30) hours of continuing education per three-year cycle commencing at the date of recognition; or

- 5. Any official court reporter who is the holder of more than one certification shall be compensated in the additional amounts specified in paragraphs 1 through 4 of this subsection for each certification up to a maximum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) per year over and above the reporter's base salary, payable monthly.
- D. Court reporters temporarily employed by the district court, Workers' Compensation Court, or Corporation Commission shall be compensated by the court fund of the court which they serve at a rate to be set by such court. In addition, court reporters temporarily employed pursuant to this subsection who are required by the terms of their employment to travel outside their county of residence, shall receive reimbursement for mileage actually and necessarily traveled to and from the place of attendance at a rate not to exceed the rate of reimbursement specified in the State Travel Reimbursement Act for state employees. Any travel reimbursement shall be paid from the court fund of the court where the service of the temporarily employed court reporter is provided.
- SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.
- SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

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declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
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    be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
