## HOUSE BILL NO. 4399

April 29, 2025, Introduced by Reps. Prestin, Outman, Frisbie, Tisdel, Bohnak, Cavitt, Markkanen, Schmaltz, Borton, Rheingans, Neeley, Pohutsky and VanderWall and referred to Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending sections 17201, 17210, 17211a, and 17212 (MCL 333.17201, 333.17210, 333.17211a, and 333.17212), sections 17201 and 17212 as amended and section 17211a as added by 2016 PA 499 and section 17210 as amended by 2021 PA 53, and by adding section 17210a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 17201. (1) As used in this part:

2 (a) "Advanced practice registered nurse" or "a.p.r.n." means a
3 registered professional nurse who has been granted a specialty
4 certification under section 17210 in 1 of the following health
5 profession specialty fields:

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6 (*i*) Nurse midwifery.

7 (*ii*) Nurse practitioner.

8 (*iii*) Clinical nurse specialist.

9 (b) "Physician" means a physician who is licensed under part10 170 or part 175.

11 (c) "Practice-Subject to sections 17210 and 17210a, "practice 12 of nursing" means the systematic application of substantial specialized knowledge and skill, derived from the biological, 13 14 physical, and behavioral sciences, to the care, treatment, counsel, 15 and health teaching of individuals who are experiencing changes in 16 the normal health processes or who require assistance in the 17 maintenance of health and the prevention or management of illness, 18 injury, or disability.

(d) "Practice of nursing as a licensed practical nurse" or "l.p.n." means the practice of nursing based on less comprehensive knowledge and skill than that required of a registered professional nurse and performed under the supervision of a registered professional nurse, physician, or dentist.

(e) "Registered professional nurse" or "r.n." means an
individual who is licensed under this part to engage in the
practice of nursing which scope of practice includes the teaching,
direction, and supervision of less skilled personnel in the
performance of delegated nursing activities.

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(2) In addition to the definitions in this part, article 1

contains general definitions and principles of construction
 applicable to all articles in the code and part 161 contains
 definitions applicable to this part.

Sec. 17210. (1) The Michigan-Subject to this section and
section 17210a, the board of nursing may grant a specialty
certification to a registered professional nurse who has advanced
training beyond that required for initial licensure, who has
demonstrated competency through examination or other evaluative
processes, and who practices in 1 of the following health
profession specialty fields:

11 (a) Nurse midwifery.

12 (b) Nurse anesthetist.

13 (c) Nurse practitioner.

14 (d) Subject to subsection (2), clinical Clinical nurse 15 specialist.

16 (2) The Michigan board of nursing shall promulgate rules 17 establishing the qualifications for the training and competency of 18 the health profession specialty field of clinical nurse specialist. 19 The Michigan board of nursing shall not grant a specialty 20 certification as a clinical nurse specialist under subsection (1) 21 until after the effective date of the rules promulgated under this 22 subsection.

(3) All of the following apply to a registered professional
nurse who holds a specialty certification as a nurse anesthetist:
(a) In addition to performing duties within the scope of the
practice of nursing, his or her the individual's scope of practice
includes any of the following anesthesia and analgesia services if

28 the services are performed in accordance with the American

29 Association of Nurse Anesthetists Standards for Nurse Anesthesia

1 Practice:

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(*i*) Development of Developing a plan of care.

3 (*ii*) Performance of Performing all patient assessments,
4 procedures, and monitoring to implement the plan of care or to
5 address patient emergencies that arise during implementation of the
6 plan of care.

7 (iii) Selection, Selecting, ordering, or prescribing and the 8 administration of administering anesthesia and analgesic agents, 9 including pharmacological agents that are prescription drugs as defined in section 17708 or controlled substances. For purposes of 10 11 this subparagraph, the authority of a registered professional nurse 12 who holds a specialty certification as a nurse anesthetist to 13 prescribe pharmacological agents is limited to pharmacological 14 agents for administration to patients as described in subdivision 15 (b), (c), or (d), and his or her the individual's authority does 16 not include any activity that would permit a patient to self-17 administer, obtain, or receive pharmacological agents, including 18 prescription drugs or controlled substances, outside of the 19 facility in which the anesthetic or analgesic service is performed 20 or beyond the perioperative, periobstetrical, or periprocedural 21 period.

(b) If he or she the individual meets both of the following requirements, he or she the individual may provide the anesthesia and analgesia services described in subdivision (a) without supervision:

26 (i) He or she The individual meets either of the following:
27 (A) He or she The individual has practiced in the health
28 profession specialty field of nurse anesthetist for 3 years or more
29 and has practiced in that health profession specialty field in a

1 health care facility for a minimum of 4,000 hours.

2 (B) He or she The individual has a doctor of nurse anesthesia
3 practice degree or doctor of nursing practice degree.

4 (*ii*) He or she The individual is collaboratively participating
5 in a patient-centered care team.

6 (c) He or she The individual may provide the anesthesia and 7 analgesia services described in subdivision (a) in a health care 8 facility if the health care facility has a policy in place under 9 subsection (4) allowing for the provision of the anesthesia and 10 analgesia services and ensuring that a qualified health care 11 professional is immediately available in person or through 12 telemedicine to address any urgent or emergent clinical concerns.

13 (d) The anesthesia and analgesia services described in
14 subdivision (a) may be performed for and during the perioperative,
15 periobstetrical, or periprocedural period.

16 (e) If he or she the individual is practicing pain management
17 in a freestanding pain clinic, he or she the individual must be
18 under the supervision of a physician.

19 (4) A health care facility may adopt policies relating to the 20 provision of anesthesia and analgesia services. If a health care 21 facility uses a registered professional nurse who holds a specialty 22 certification as a nurse anesthetist to perform the anesthesia and 23 analgesia services described in subsection (3) who is not employed by the health care facility, the health care facility shall ensure 24 25 that the registered professional nurse or the person employing the 26 registered professional nurse maintains malpractice insurance.

27 (5) Subsection (3) does not require new or additional third
 28 party-third-party reimbursement or mandated worker's compensation
 29 benefits for anesthesia and analgesia services provided under that

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subsection by a registered professional nurse who holds a specialty
 certification as a nurse anesthetist under this part.

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(6) As used in this section:

4 (a) "Collaboratively participating" means practicing and
5 communicating with health care professionals involved in the
6 patient-centered care team to optimize the overall care delivered
7 to the patient.

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(b) "Health care facility" means any of the following:

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(i) A hospital inpatient or outpatient facility.

10 (*ii*) A freestanding surgical outpatient facility.

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(iii) An office of a physician, podiatrist, or dentist.

12 (*iv*) Any other office or facility in which diagnostic or 13 therapeutic procedures are provided to a patient, including, but 14 not limited to, imaging, endoscopy, or cystoscopy services.

15 (c) "Health care professional" means an individual who is 16 licensed or registered to perform a health profession under this 17 article.

(d) "Patient-centered care team" means a group of health care professionals, which must include, but is not limited to, a qualified health care professional, who directly or indirectly care for a patient by each contributing his or her the professional's specialized knowledge, skill, and experience to the care of the patient.

(e) "Qualified health care professional" means any of the
following health care professionals who has completed the necessary
education, training, and experience in anesthesia care or
pharmacology, or has experience with procedures requiring
anesthesia:

29 (i) A physician.

(ii) A dentist licensed under part 166.

(iii) A podiatric physician licensed under part 180.

3 Sec. 17210a. (1) The board may grant a specialty certification as a nurse practitioner under section 17210 to a registered 4 5 professional nurse who meets all of the following requirements:

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(a) Has completed a graduate, postgraduate, or doctoral level 7 nursing education program that the board determines prepares the 8 registered professional nurse for the health profession specialty 9 field of nurse practitioner.

10 (b) Holds a certification from a nationally accredited certification body approved by the board. 11

12 (c) Meets any other requirement established by the board by 13 rule.

14 (2) All of the following apply to a registered professional 15 nurse who holds a specialty certification as a nurse practitioner:

16 (a) In addition to performing duties within the practice of 17 nursing, the individual's scope of practice includes all of the 18 following:

19 (i) Performing comprehensive assessments, providing physical 20 examinations and other health assessments, and providing screening 21 activities.

22 (ii) Diagnosing, treating, and managing patients with acute and 23 chronic illnesses and diseases.

24 (iii) Ordering, performing, supervising, and interpreting 25 laboratory and imaging studies.

26 (*iv*) Prescribing pharmacological and nonpharmacological 27 interventions and treatments that are within the registered 28 professional nurse's specialty role.

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(v) Engaging in health promotion and disease prevention.

(vi) Providing health education.

2 (vii) Counseling patients and families with potential, acute,
3 and chronic health disorders.

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(b) The individual shall do both of the following:

5 (*i*) Comply with the standards established by the board and with 6 the national accreditation standards of the national professional 7 nursing associations applicable to the individual's specialty 8 certification.

9 (*ii*) Consult with other health professionals and refer a 10 patient to other health professionals, as the board considers 11 appropriate.

12 (c) The individual may supervise registered professional
13 nurses, licensed practical nurses, and other individuals performing
14 health occupations.

15 Sec. 17211a. (1) An advanced practice registered nurse may 16 prescribe any of the following:

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(a) A nonscheduled prescription drug.

18 (b) Subject to subsection (2), Except as otherwise provided in
19 subsection (2), a controlled substance included in schedules 2 to 5
20 of part 72, as a delegated act of a physician.

21 (2) If an advanced practice registered nurse prescribes a 22 controlled substance under subsection (1) (b), this subdivision, 23 both the advanced practice registered nurse's name and the 24 physician's name shall must be used, recorded, or otherwise 25 indicated in connection with that prescription, . If an advanced 26 practice registered nurse prescribes a controlled substance under 27 subsection (1) (b), and both the advanced practice registered nurse's and the physician's DEA registration numbers shall must be 28 29 used, recorded, or otherwise indicated in connection with that

1 prescription.

2 (2) An advanced practice registered nurse who holds a 3 specialty certification in the specialty field of nurse practitioner may prescribe a controlled substance included in 4 5 schedules 2 to 5 of part 72 without delegation from a physician if 6 the advanced practice registered nurse prescribes the controlled 7 substance while practicing in the health profession specialty field 8 of nurse practitioner. If a controlled substance is prescribed 9 under this subsection, only the name of the advanced practice 10 registered nurse described in this subsection must be used, 11 recorded, or otherwise indicated in connection with the prescription and only the advanced practice registered nurse's DEA 12 13 registration number must be used, recorded, or otherwise indicated 14 in connection with the prescription.

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15 (3) The amendatory act that added this This section does not 16 require new or additional third-party reimbursement or mandated 17 worker's compensation benefits for services rendered by an advanced 18 practice registered nurse who is authorized to prescribe 19 nonscheduled prescription drugs and controlled substances included 20 in schedules 2 to 5 of part 72. under this section.

21 Sec. 17212. (1) Subject to subsections (2), and (3), and (4), 22 in addition to acts, tasks, and functions delegated under section 23 16215, 17211a(1)(b), 17745, 17745a, or 17745b, a supervising 24 physician may delegate in writing to a registered professional 25 nurse the ordering, receipt, and dispensing of complimentary starter dose drugs other than controlled substances as defined in 26 27 article 7 or federal law. If a delegated ordering, receipt, or 28 dispensing of complimentary starter dose drugs described in this 29 subsection occurs, both the registered professional nurse's name

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and the supervising physician's name shall must be used, recorded,
 or otherwise indicated in connection with each order, receipt, or
 dispensing.

4 (2) Subject to subsection (3), an An advanced practice
5 registered nurse may order, receive, and dispense a complimentary
6 starter dose drug other than a controlled substance without
7 delegation from a physician. Only the name of the advanced practice
8 registered nurse shall must be used, recorded, or otherwise
9 indicated in connection with an order, receipt, or dispensing of a
10 complimentary starter dose drug under this subsection.

11 (3) An-Except as otherwise provided in subsection (4), an advanced practice registered nurse may order, receive, and dispense 12 complimentary starter doses of controlled substances included in 13 14 schedules 2 to 5 of part 72 as a delegated act of a physician. If a 15 delegated ordering, receipt, or dispensing of complimentary starter 16 dose drugs described in this subsection occurs, the advanced practice registered nurse's name and the delegating physician's 17 name shall must be used, recorded, or otherwise indicated in 18 connection with each order, receipt, or dispensing and both the 19 20 advanced practice registered nurse's and the delegating physician's 21 DEA registration number shall must be used, recorded, or otherwise indicated in connection with each order, receipt, or dispensing. 22

(4) An advanced practice registered nurse who holds a
specialty certification in the specialty field of nurse
practitioner may order, receive, and dispense complimentary starter
doses of controlled substances included in schedules 2 to 5 of part
72 without delegation from a physician. If an advanced practice
registered nurse described in this subsection orders, receives, or
dispenses a complimentary starter dose drug described in this

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subsection, only the advanced practice registered nurse's name must
 be used, recorded, or otherwise indicated in connection with each
 order, receipt, or dispensing and only the advanced practice
 registered nurse's DEA registration number must be used, recorded,
 or otherwise indicated in connection with each order, receipt, or
 dispensing.

7 (5) (4) It is the intent of the legislature in enacting this 8 section to allow a pharmaceutical manufacturer or wholesale 9 distributor, as those terms are defined in part 177, sections 17706 10 and 17709, to distribute complimentary starter dose drugs to an advanced practice registered nurse described in subsections (2), 11 and (3), and (4), or to a registered professional nurse described 12 in subsection (1), in compliance with section 503(d) of the federal 13 14 food, drug, and cosmetic act, 21 USC 353.

15 (6) (5) As used in this section, "complimentary starter dose"
16 means that term as defined in section 17745.
