22		involving patients, family members, or other persons who pose a risk		
23		to themselves or others due to mental illness or substance use disorder

	Annually by December 15, the Administrative Office of the Courts shall report to the		
	Division of Health Service Regulation and the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health		
	and Human Services on the number of persons charged or convicted during the preceding		
	calendar year of a crime under G.S. 14-34.6."		
	SECTION 3.(a) By October 1, 2023, the Department of Health and Human Services		
	shall notify all hospitals licensed under Article 5 of Chapter 131E of the General Statutes about		
	the requirements of Part 3A of Article 5 of Chapter 131E of the General Statutes, as enacted by		
	this act, and, along with such notification, provide information on the process for reporting		
	hospital injuries resulting from acts of violence to appropriate law enforcement agencies.		
	SECTION 3.(b) The first report under G.S. 131E-88.2, as enacted by this act, is due		
	from the Administrative Office of the Courts on or before December 15, 2023.		
	SECTION 4. Section 3 of this act is effective when it becomes law. The remainder		
	of this act becomes effective October 1, 2023.
