19	(2a)	"Home care agency director" means the person having administrative				
20		responsibility for the operation of the licensed agency site.				
21	(2b)	"Home care client" means an individual who receives home care services.				
22	(3)	"Home care services" means any of the following services and directly related				
23		medical supplies and appliances, which are provided to an individual in a				
24		place of temporary or permanent residence used as an individual's home:				
25		a. Nursing care provided by or under the supervision of a registered				
26		nurse.				
27		b. Physical, occupational, or speech therapy, when provided to an				
28		individual who also is receiving nursing services, or any other of these				
29		therapy services, in a place of temporary or permanent residence used				
30		as the individual's home.

8	SECTION 1.(d) A home assistance services provider is prohibited from submitting					
9	claims for reimbursement to a private or government-funded health insurer, managed care					
10	organization, or health plan for services rendered to or on behalf of a North Carolina resident.
