The board of directors shall not 15 16 require school personnel to pay for the fingerprints authorized under this section. 17 The board of directors shall review the criminal history it receives on an individual. (d) 18 The board of directors shall determine whether the results of the review indicate that the 19 individual (i) poses a threat to the physical safety of students or personnel or (ii) has demonstrated 20 that he or she does not have the integrity or honesty to fulfill his or her duties as school personnel 21 and shall use the information when making employment decisions and decisions with regard to independent contractors. The board of directors shall make written findings with regard to how 22 23 it used the information when making employment decisions and decisions with regard to 24 independent contractors. The board of directors may delegate any of the duties in this subsection 25 to the principal. 26 (e) The board of directors, or the principal if designated by the board of directors, shall 27 provide to the State Board of Education the criminal history it receives on a person who is 28 certificated, certified, or licensed by the State Board of Education. The State Board of Education 29 shall review the criminal history and determine whether the person's certificate or license should 30 be revoked in accordance with State laws and rules regarding revocation. 31 All of the information received by the board of directors through the checking of the (f) 32 criminal history or by the State Board of Education in accordance with this section is privileged 33 information and is not a public record but is for the exclusive use of the board of directors or the 34 State Board of Education. The board of directors or the State Board of Education may destroy 35 the information after it is used for the purposes authorized by this section after one calendar year. 36 There shall be no liability for negligence on the part of the board of directors, or its (g) 37 employees, or the State Board of Education, the Superintendent of Public Instruction, or any of 38 their members or employees, individually or collectively, arising from any act taken or omission 39 by any of them in carrying out the provisions of this section. The immunity established by this 40 subsection shall not extend to gross negligence, wanton conduct, or intentional wrongdoing that 41 would otherwise be actionable.
