The Committee on Labor and Public Employees reported through REP. PORTER of the 94th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING WORKERS' COMPENSATION FOR DISPATCHERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. Subparagraph (A) of subdivision (1) of section 31-275 of the
- 2 2022 supplement to the general statutes is repealed and the following is
- 3 substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2022*):
- 4 (A) (i) For a police officer or firefighter, "in the course of his employment" encompasses such individual's departure from such individual's place of abode to duty, such individual's duty, and the
- 7 return to such individual's place of abode after duty;
- 8 (ii) For an employee of the Department of Correction or a
- 9 <u>telecommunicator, as defined in section 28-30</u>, (I) when responding to a
- 10 direct order to appear at his or her work assignment under 11 circumstances in which nonessential employees are excused from
- circumstances in which nonessential employees are excused from working, or (II) following two or more mandatory overtime work shifts
- on consecutive days, "in the course of his employment" encompasses

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such individual's departure from such individual's place of abode directly to duty, such individual's duty, and the return directly to such individual's place of abode after duty;

(iii) Notwithstanding the provisions of clauses (i) and (ii) of this subparagraph, the dependents of any deceased employee of the Department of Correction who was injured in the course of his employment, as defined in this subparagraph, on or after July 1, 2000, and who died not later than July 15, 2000, shall be paid compensation on account of the death, in accordance with the provisions of section 31-306, retroactively to the date of the employee's death. The cost of the payment shall be paid by the employer or its insurance carrier which shall be reimbursed for such cost from the Second Injury Fund as provided in section 31-354 upon presentation of any vouchers and information that the Treasurer may require;

Explanation

The bill results in a potential cost to the state or self-insured municipality resulting from an increase in medical and indemnity claims and premium costs to the extent that certain employees apply for Workers' Compensation benefits and meet the other conditions of the bill. The bill establishes portal-to-portal workers' compensation coverage for any individual employed as a telecommunications operator by a public safety agency, as defined in Section 28-25.

The Out Years

The annualized ongoing fiscal impact identified above would continue into the future subject to inflation.

¹ State mandate is defined in Sec. 2-32b(2) of the Connecticut General Statutes, "state mandate" means any state initiated constitutional, statutory or executive action that requires a local government to establish, expand or modify its activities in such a way as to necessitate additional expenditures from local revenues.

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OLR Bill Analysis HB 5251

AN ACT CONCERNING WORKERS' COMPENSATION FOR DISPATCHERS.

SUMMARY

This bill extends "portal-to-portal" workers' compensation coverage to telecommunicators (i.e., 9-1-1 emergency dispatchers) in two situations: (1) when responding to a direct order to appear at their work assignment when nonessential employees are excused from working or (2) after working two or more mandatory overtime shifts on consecutive days.

With "portal-to-portal" coverage, an injury that occurs while the employee is travelling directly between his or her home and workplace is deemed to have occurred in the course of the employee's employment, making him or her eligible to receive workers' compensation benefits for the injury. Current law provides portal-to-portal coverage to police officers and firefighters and, under the same limited circumstances that the bill applies to dispatchers, Department of Correction employees.
